- Development of three architectural concepts that represent the Burbank Glendale Pasadena "Sense of Place" defined through the Public Design Charettes
- Refinement of the design concepts to assess function, form, materials, and environmental sustainability
- Selection of architectural design concept to develop for the RPT








Community Engagement

- Original concept image boards displayed at 3 City Halls, 3 Burbank libraries, and the Airport on March 13th
- On-line and physical survey forms provided venue for public comments to capture feedback on the three design concepts, provided in English and Spanish
- Refined concept image boards replaced original image boards on April 3rd
- Comment period closed on April 10th
- 73% of survey participants were residents of Burbank, Glendale or Pasadena

- Where possible, the interior of the terminal shall be visually opened to the outside
- Access to natural light and views to the exterior from the landside and airside







- Form and appearance shall not be sacrificed for function
- Each concept design created from an operationally functional plan








- Architectural style, colors, and materials for the terminal shall be applied to the adjacent parking structures so there is consistency between terminal and structures
- Each concept embraces style, color, and materials consistently between structures








- The design shall promote a truly multi-modal experience and link to mass transit
- Pedestrian and vehicular access provided from the north and south Metrolink stations







- The design shall promote a truly multi-modal experience and link to mass transit
- Commercial access priority provided to busses and shuttles along protected curb







- The design shall deliver memorable "gateway experiences" for visitors who begin and end their visit at the airport
- Impressive entry and connection to the public plaza unlike any other airport







Influence and Inspiration – Sources of Influences

Three initial ideas derived for the Influence and Inspiration of the Burbank Glendale Pasadena Region –

- The "Century"
 - Influenced by mid-Century architecture
 - Earmarked by simple forms and clean lines
 - Entry into a light filled hall
- The "Icon"
 - Inspired by the glitz and glamour of Hollywood
 - Recognition of film industry's roots
 - Overarching canopy morphs into the façade of the garage
 - Reminiscent of the silver screen in the public plaza
- The "Paseo"
 - Indicative of intimacy and human scale
 - Connection to the outdoors
 - Combination of light and shadows play throughout the facility
