5. PRESENTATIONS

- a. AIRPORT AUTHORITY POLICE OFFICER OF THE YEAR. No staff report is attached. The Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Police Department Officer of the Year is Officer Frank Litterini. Officer Litterni, who joined the Department in May 2018, has made a significant impact on the day-to-day operations with his overall positive attitude, willingness to "go the extra mile" for the Department, treating every person he meets with respect, and representing the Authority exceptionally well. This honor is given to Officer Litterini because he exemplifies the qualities and standards of a BGPAA Airport Police Officer; honor, courage, compassion and integrity.
- b. AIRPORT AUTHORITY FIRE DEPARTMENT FIREFIGHTER OF THE YEAR No staff report is attached. The Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority Fire Department Firefighter of the Year is Captain Chad Peterson, a fifteen-year veteran of the Department who has also served as a Sergeant in the United States Marine Corps. In addition to his Shift Captain duties, Captain Peterson oversees the department's training program. He has effectively managed and executed a comprehensive training program that has resulted in an enhanced level of emergency response, and a successful completion of last year's FAA Annual Part 139 inspection. Captain Peterson developed and managed an online training tracking system that ensures accurate record keeping for the Part 139 ARFF inspection, which was described as "a model for other ARFF departments" by FAA inspectors. In a one-year period, Captain Peterson's revised training program now provides for Driver Operator 1A, Hazardous Materials First Responder Operations. Hazardous Material Incident Commander, California State Firefighter II. and Company Officer professional development series curriculum to the department. In recognition of his efforts to achieve a superior level of training in such a short time period, Captain Peterson is presented as the department's 2018 Firefighter of the Year.

At the March 18, 2019 meeting of the Legal, Government and Environmental Affairs Committee ("Committee"), the Committee voted (2–0, one absent) to recommend that the Commission approve a five-year extension of the Extended Maintenance and Support Agreement with Bruel & Kjaer EMS Inc., for continued services in support of the Airport Noise and Operations Management System. Proposed Amendment No. 2 to the Services Agreement is attached and referenced as Exhibit A. The cost for the first year of the proposed extension period is \$102,352 with a proposed annual increase of 3% per year, which is the same condition contained in the original agreement.

("RDM"), for the design of Taxiway A rehabilitation in the amount of \$271,310, a not to exceed amount of \$27,000 for in-house staff design management and support, and establish a Project Aggregate Contingency of approximately 5% of the estimated total project budget in the amount of \$15,000.

Staff reported that Taxiway A is the Airport's primary taxiway and the pavement in portions of the middle section, the keel section and several taxiway connectors, A1, A2, and A3, have exceeded their useful life. Taxiway A was last rehabilitated in 2008 and the pavement condition index indicates that the pavement needs rehabilitation.

Staff anticipates the design to be completed within the next three months and the construction completed this summer 2019.

Following questions from the Committee, the Committee concurred with Staff's recommendation that this item move to the full Commission immediately following the Committee meeting.

a. Transportation Network Company Passenger Loading and Unloading Fee Increase

Staff presented to the Commission a request for approval for an increase in the Transportation Network Companies ("TNCs") Passenger Loading and Unloading Fees. The TNCs operate at the Hollywood Burbank Airport pursuant to an airport access facility use agreement. The agreement requires TNC operators to pay a \$3 unloading and a \$3 loading fee. The agreement also allows the Authority to increase these fees with a 35-day written notice to the operators.

Since the start of the service provided by the TNCs, traffic has increased significantly, which requires an increase in traffic management and supervision. Staff recommended an increase of \$.50 in the passenger loading and unloading fees to cover the cost of the additional services.

At the February 19, 2019, meeting of the Operations and Development Committee ("Committee"), the Committee voted (2-0, one absent) to recommend approval of the increase in Transportation Network Company Passenger Loading and Unloading Fees from \$3.00 to \$3.50.

b. Amendment No. 1 to Agreement for Self-Park **Management Services and** Valet Parking Services: **Purchase Order for** Additional Parking Equipment; Licensing and **Development Fee** Allowance

Staff presented to the Commission for approval an Amendment No. 1 to the Agreement for Self-Park Management Services and Valet Parking Services with SP Plus Corporation ("SP+") which specifies implementation and management requirements for an e-commerce platform and to reinforce applicability of their indemnification obligations to that platform; a Purchase Order for Additional Parking Equipment to Sentry Control Systems LLC ("Sentry") for the purchase and installation of Skidata gate entry columns and barcode scanners for the pre-booking self-park revenue control equipment; and authorization of a \$10,000 allowance for a Licensing and Development Fees Allowance to CVPS to connect the CVPS system with SP+'s

subcontractor, MAG US Parking Management ("MAG").

As part of the Agreement SP+ will implement and manage an e-Commerce platform for online pre-booking parking system by July 1, 2019, for all of the parking products at the Airport.

The implementation of the pre-booking parking system will be on-going, and Staff will be monitoring the performance of this system to ensure integration with the Airport's current parking systems and website to provide the best customer experience. As defined in the Amendment, SP+ and MAG will implement this pre-booking parking system for Valet Parking on July 1, 2019, following a 30-day testing period. It is intended that the pre-booking parking system is implemented at Self-Park lots shortly thereafter.

The adopted FY 2019 budget includes \$150,000 for an e-Commerce booking platform which will address the cost of implementation for the API system integration expenses of estimated not-to-exceed \$10,000 and the Skidata gate entry equipment in the amount of \$68,624.

At the Operations and Development Committee ("Committee") meeting held immediately prior to the Commission meeting, the Committee voted (2–0, one absent) to recommend approval of the Amendment No. 1 to Agreement for Self-Park Management Services and Valet Parking Services; Purchase Order for Additional Parking Equipment; Licensing and Development Fee Allowance.

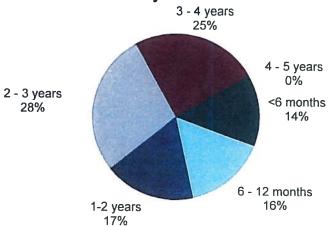

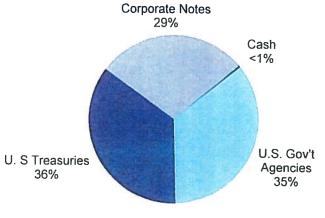

Sector Allocation

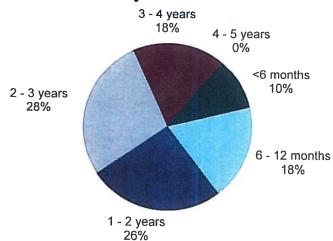




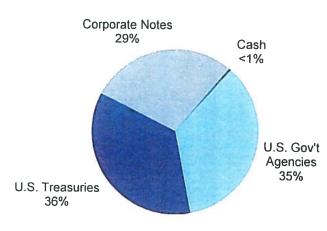
PFC Portfolio Investment Guidelines Conformance as of January 31, 2019

NOTES TO SCHEDULE OF CASH RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS MONTH AND SEVEN MONTHS ENDED JANUARY 31, 2019 & 2018

General Comments

The Schedule of Cash Receipts and Disbursements ("Schedule") represents the cash basis activity for the month and fiscal year-to-date ("FYTD") compared to the allocation of the annual adopted budget.

The Schedule consists of two sections: Operating Activity and Facility Improvement/Noise Mitigation Transactions. Receipts are shown as positive amounts and disbursements as negative amounts. Favorable budget variances are shown as positive amounts and unfavorable variances as negative amounts. Because this Schedule is on a cash basis, cash timing differences may contribute to budget variances.

The Operating Activity receipts include charges for services (parking, landing fees and concessions), tenant rents, fuel flowage fees, other revenues and investment receipts. The Operating Activity disbursements include costs of services, materials, contracts, personnel and debt service.

Facility Improvement / Noise Mitigation Transactions represent the activity for the Authority's capital program, which consists of the Sound Insulation Program and Other Facility Improvement Program Projects.

The FY 2019 Capital Program expenditures are primarily funded by the following sources:

- FAA-approved Passenger Facility Charge ("PFC") program receipts/reserves;
- Grants:
- Facility Development Funds (Authority Reserves).

The notes below provide additional information regarding the performance results detailed in the "Schedule of Cash Receipts and Disbursements."

A Supplemental Schedule of Cash Receipts and Disbursements reflecting the activities related to the Series 2012 Bond debt service and repayment to the Authority of the loans provided to the Rent-A-Car Companies ("RACs") for the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center / Consolidated Rental Car Facility is also presented.

NOTE (1) - Cash Receipts from Operations

Cash receipts from operations are ahead of budget FYTD December. On an accrual basis, operating revenues are favorably ahead of budget FYTD January by \$2,832,486. See notes 2 through 8 for additional information regarding operating receipts.

NOTE (2) - Landing/Fuel Fees

Landing fees are based on landed weight of the aircraft. Fuel fees are charged at a rate of \$0.05 a gallon to non-signatory air carriers for fuel loaded at BUR. The landing fee component of this category is trending under budget primarily due to the one year incentive fee waiver provided on flights to new destinations. On an accrual basis, when combined with the positive fuel flowage fee performance, this category is favorably ahead of budget FYTD January by \$41,987.

NOTE (3) - Parking Fees

Parking fee revenues are performing ahead of the budget forecast. Accrual basis parking fees are \$571,291 ahead of budget FYTD January.

NOTE (4) - Rental Receipts - Terminal Building

Terminal Building rental receipts exceed the budget FYTD January due to the timing of receipts and additional concession revenues received above the minimum annual guarantee. Accrual basis terminal building rents are \$636,859 ahead of budget FYTD January. The positive FYTD January passenger growth of 9.27% has contributed to achieving the favorable performance results.

NOTE (5) - Rental Receipts - Other Buildings

Other Buildings rental receipts are under budget FYTD January due to the timing of receipts. Accrual basis Other Building receipts are \$178,358 ahead of budget FYTD January.

NOTE (6) - Ground Transportation

This category consists of off-airport access fees and TNC activity. Ground Transportation receipts exceed the budget FYTD January. Accrual basis ground transportation receipts are \$404,106 ahead of budget FYTD January primarily due to TNC activity.

NOTE (7) - Other Receipts

FYTD January Other Receipts include a rent deposit of \$329,098 from Star Aviation for the lease of Hangar 22 which was awarded by the Commission in October 2018 and an insurance reimbursement of \$146,475 to repair the roof of Hangar 2 which was damaged by the wind last fiscal year (April 2018). Accrual basis Other Receipts are \$320,813 ahead of budget FYTD January.

NOTE (8) - Investment Receipts - Treasurer

This line item represents cash received from the investment of funds. These receipts fluctuate in response to interest rate and portfolio balance changes and the timing of coupon payments and individual investment maturities and sales. Accrual basis investment income, including the interest earned on loans to Rent-A-Car Companies, exceeds the budget by \$679,072 FYTD January.

NOTE (9) - Cash Disbursements from Operations

Overall operating disbursements are favorably under budget FYTD January. On an accrual basis operating disbursements are favorably within budget parameters. See additional information on operating disbursements in notes 10 through 16.

NOTE (10) - Administrative Supplies & Costs

This line item includes office supplies, printing, postage and delivery, office equipment service and lease, recruiting, membership, uniform, Commission meeting, conference and training costs.

NOTE (11) - Operating Supplies & Maintenance

This line item includes utilities, fuel, general repairs and maintenance, landscaping, supplies and telephone costs.

NOTE (12) - Contractual Operating Costs

This line item includes various contractual operating costs such as ARFF services, janitorial services, systems and vehicle repair, parking operations and the TBI Airport Management contract costs.

NOTE (13) - Contractual Professional Services

This line item includes various professional services such as legal, auditing, noise, financial and insurance.

NOTE (14) - Wages and Benefits

Wages and Benefits consist of payroll and fringe benefit costs for the Airport Police officers, and include the impact of the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding effective February 2017. Wages and benefits include overtime for film location services which are recovered through the related film revenue.

NOTE (15) - Other Operating Costs

This line item includes public relations/advertising, air service retention, license and permits and bad debt expense.

NOTE (16) - Parking Tax

The 12% City of Burbank parking tax is paid quarterly for the prior three-month period. January 2019 remittance, in the amount of \$575,946.26, covers parking activity for the months of October, November and December 2018.

NOTE (17) - Sound Insulation Program

The Sound Insulation program is funded primarily through FAA Airport Improvement Program ("AIP") grants and and Passenger Facility Charge ("PFC") revenues. In December 2016, the FAA issued a Record of Approval on the Part 150 Study which has recently been recertified by FAA. Staff is awaiting FAA's decision to award a noise discretionary grant, the receipt of which will facilitate the restart of the program.

NOTE (18) - Other Facility Improvement Program Projects

Other Facility Improvement Program Projects costs are under budget FYTD January by \$2,247,224 due to the timing of expenditures of certain projects.

NOTE (19) - FAA Grants - Other Facility Improvement Program Projects

FAA Grants are budgeted to partially fund the Taxiway C & D, GA Ramp Rehabilitation Project and Land Acquisition of Hollyona Property.

NOTE (20) - Other Grants

Other grants represent federal grants, other than FAA AIP grants, and local grants that fund or partially fund the Ground Access Study.

NOTE (21) - Passenger Facility Charge Receipts/Reserves

A number of capital projects are budgeted to be funded or partially funded by Passenger Facility Charges, including the Taxiway C & D and GA Ramp Rehabilitation Project, Terminal Ramp Rehabilitation and and Airfield Lighting System Rehabilitation.

NOTE (22) - Facility Development Fund (Authority Reserves)

The FY 2019 adopted budget programmed the use of Authority Reserves as a funding source for the airport share of Replacement Terminal Project.

General Comments

The debt service on the 2012 Revenue Bonds and the repayment to the Authority of the loans to the Rent-A-Car Companies ("RACs") is payable from Customer Facility Charges ("CFCs") and Facility Rents. Under the terms of the Bond Indenture, as amended, all CFCs collected subsequent to July 1, 2014 are remitted to the Bond Trustee for the 2012 Bond debt service.

On July 1, 2014, the terms and conditions of the Non-Exclusive Concession and Lease Agreement with the respective Rent-A-Car Companies became effective, including the collection of Facility Rent.

Note (1) - Customer Facility Charge ("CFC") Receipts

CFCs of \$6 per day per transaction, up to a maximum of five days, are collected and applied to the 2012 Bond debt service. CFCs received FYTD January exceeded the budget due to better than expected car rental activity.

Note (2) - Facility Rent

Facility Rent exceeds the budget FYTD January due to the timing of receipts.

Note (3) - Loan Principal Repayments to the Authority

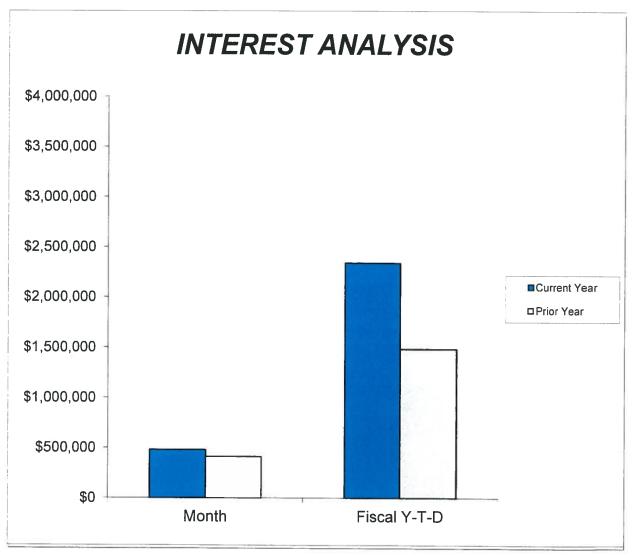
Repayments of the loan principal to the Authority from the Rent-A-Car Companies exceed the budget FYTD January due to timing of receipts. The principal portion of the payment will be deposited as reimbursement to the Authority's Facility Development Fund. The interest portion of the loan repayment is recorded as investment income.

Note (4) - Net RITC / ConRAC Facility Payments and Collections

A positive amount in this line indicates that cash has been received above the required payment obligations. At fiscal year-end, upon conclusion of the required reconciliation, any excess surplus accumulated will be evaluated and applied toward the allowed uses under the terms and conditions of the Non-Exclusive Concession and Lease Agreement with the Rent-A-Car Companies.

In the event of a shortfall of receipts to meet the required payment obligations (i.e., CFC collections perform under budget projections), the Authority holds the right to adjust the Facility Rent paid by the rental car companies on a 30-day notice.

ANNUAL REVIEW AND ADJUSTMENT OF NOISE VIOLATION FINES

SUMMARY

At the March 18, 2019, meeting of the Legal, Government and Environmental Affairs Committee ("Committee"), the Committee voted (2–0, one absent) to recommend that the Commission authorize an increase to the noise fines associated with certain restricted operations as detailed in Rules 8 and 9, as described below, in accordance with the annual adjustment of noise violation fines required by Resolution No. 382.

BACKGROUND

Resolution No. 382 was adopted by the Commission on March 20, 2003, which requires noise violation fines contained in Rules 8 and 9 be adjusted annually for inflation based on percentage changes in the Consumer Price Index ("CPI"). The January index is used to calculate the annual adjustment and the new rates become effective each April 1st.

Rule 8 prohibits the following activities between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.:

- Intersection takeoffs
- "Touch and go" landings
- Maintenance run-ups
- Flight training operations
- Practice approaches

The current first-time fine is \$1,508 and the fine for subsequent violations is \$2,190.

Rule 9 prohibits the operation of certain "noisy" aircraft between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m., pursuant to FAA Advisory Circular 36-1H. The current fine for each violation is \$4,384.

The 2012 FAA Modernization and Reform Act required owners/operators of aircraft that weigh less than 75,000 pounds that do not meet FAA Stage 3 noise levels to modify or retire their aircraft by December 31, 2015. This statute has been fully implemented, however, existing Airport Noise Rules do include weight limits provided by Gulfstream that are applicable to their Models G-IIB and G-III that are necessary, in addition to Stage 3 hush kits in order for them to be in compliance. Currently, there is one Gulfstream III aircraft based out of Atlantic Aviation, which operated 4 times during the nighttime hours in 2018, under the weight limit. However, this rule also applies to all itinerant aircraft operations.

In 2018, Staff investigated 20 operations from general aviation operators for suspected violations. After further investigation, they were all determined to be in compliance with the Airport Noise Rules, for which none had exceeded the gross weight limit of 55,500 for a G3 aircraft operating during the nighttime hours.

JANUARY CPI INDEX LEVEL

The January 2019 CPI for All Urban Consumers in the Los Angeles, Long Beach and Anaheim area is 269.47 according to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Standards. This level represents an approximate increase of 3.15% when compared to the January 2018 index reading of 261.24. Applying this CPI value to the current fines results in the following revised fines levels for Rule 8 and Rule 9 violations:

- Rule 8: \$1,555 (first violation)
- Rule 8: \$2,259 (subsequent violations)
- Rule 9: \$4,522 (each violation)

RECOMMENDATION

At the March 18, 2019, meeting of the Legal, Government and Environmental Affairs Committee ("Committee"), the Committee voted (2–0, one absent) to recommend that the Commission approve an increase in monetary fines for violations of Rules 8 and 9 be adjusted as detailed in this staff report.

APPROVAL OF AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO THE EXTENDED MAINTENANCE AND SERVICE AGREEMENT FOR AIRPORT NOISE AND OPERATIONS MANAGEMENT SYSTEM BRUEL & KJAER EMS INC.

SUMMARY

At the March 18, 2019, meeting of the Legal, Government & Environmental Affairs Committee ("Committee"), the Committee voted (2–0, one absent) to recommend that the Commission approve a five-year extension of the Extended Maintenance and Support Agreement ("Services Agreement") with Bruel & Kjaer EMS Inc. ("B&K") for continued services in support of the Airport Noise and Operations Management System ("ANOMS"). Proposed Amendment No. 2 to the Services Agreement is attached and referenced as Exhibit A. The cost for the first year of the proposed extension period is \$102,352 with a proposed annual increase of 3% per year which is the same condition contained in the original agreement.

BACKGROUND

At the center of the Airport's noise mitigation program is the data collected and quantified by the Noise and Flight Track Monitoring System. The present noise monitoring system replaced a system that had served the Airport since April 1980 and that, due to age and enhanced features available in newer systems, required replacement.

In compliance with the California Noise Standards, the Airport Authority is required to perform noise monitoring in the vicinity of the airport for the purpose of establishing a noise impact boundary. The State's Noise Standards specify a community noise equivalent level ("CNEL") of 65 dB for the noise impact boundary. Federal Aviation Administration ("FAA") requirements also verify modeled projected noise impacts against forecasted future aircraft activity under the FAR Part 150 Noise Mitigation Studies. As more thoroughly described in Exhibit B, the current system consists of 20 noise monitoring sites located in the vicinity of the Airport, the ANOMS software, which among other features, correlates recorded noise events to flight tracks provided by the FAA, and a publicly accessible research tool known as WebTrak.

In July 2010, following a lengthy solicitation effort, the Airport Authority entered into an agreement to replace the Airport's original flight tracking system with B&K's ANOMS. This acquisition included the upgrade of all the noise monitoring locations, added 3 new monitoring sites, and the relocation of another for a total of 20 noise monitors.

The Commission previously authorized (a) a purchase agreement with B&K that included one-year service warranty and (b) a separate five-year Service Agreement which will expire on April 14, 2019. Following system design, review and approval, the components of the

system were installed by B&K with acceptance of the system occurring April 15, 2013. These agreements were originally executed by the Lochard Corporation and amended in November 2010 to reflect the name change.

SERVICES AGREEMENT

The services covered by the Services Agreement address (but are not limited to) the following aspects of the ANOMS system:

- System Management
 - o System support via telephone or email
 - o Customer visits
- Maintenance Services
 - o Fault management
 - o Software Upgrades and Patches
 - o Hardware Repair
- Technology Management and Administration Services
 - o System Monitoring for abnormal conditions
 - Periodic Hardware Services
- Information Management Services
 - Data processing Services
 - o Report Production Services
- Subscription Services
 - o Application Subscription

Pricing for the proposed amended term begins with a 3% increase to the current rate for a revised annual amount for the period of April 2019 to March 2020 of \$102,352, billed quarterly, with a 3% annual increase effective April 15th of each successive service year.

BUDGET

The adopted FY 2019 budget has appropriations for the remainder of the fiscal year for the revised fee contained in the proposed Service Agreement. For future budget years, appropriations will be requested for the annual fee of the Service Agreement as specified above.

RECOMMENDATION

At the March 18, 2019, meeting of the Legal, Government and Environmental Affairs Committee meeting, the Committee voted (2–0, one absent) to recommend that the Commission approve an Amendment No. 2 to the Services Agreement for a five-year term extension with Bruel & Kjaer EMS Inc. at the rates level described above.

EXHIBIT A

AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO NOISE AND FLIGHT TRACK MONITORING SYSTEM EXTENDED MAINTENANCE AND SUPPORT AGREEMENT

(Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority / Bruel & Kjaer EMS Inc.)

This Amendment No. 2 ("Second Amendment") to the July 19, 2010 Noise and Flight Track Monitoring System Extended Maintenance and Support Agreement ("Agreement") executed by the Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority ("Authority"), a California joint powers agency, and Bruel & Kjaer EMS Inc. ("B&K EMS"), a Delaware corporation (formerly known as Lochard Corporation), is dated April 1, 2019 for reference purposes.

RECITALS

- A. B&K EMS designed, furnished, and installed a noise and flight track monitoring system at the Bob Hope Airport.
- B. The parties executed the Agreement to provide for B&K EMS' performance of extended warranty service (including hardware and software upgrades) for such system.
- C. The parties executed a July 19, 2010 Amendment No. 1 ("First Amendment") to the Agreement to eliminate a reference to B&K EMS' prior business name.
- D. The parties desire to amend the Agreement to: (i) provide for a five-year extension of the term; and (ii) establish a fee schedule for such extension period.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Amendment of Section 1. Subsection 1.10 of Section 1 ("Definitions") of the Agreement is amended to read as follows:
 - "1.10 "Expiration" means April 14, 2024."
- 2. Amendment of Section 1. Subsection 1.33 of Section 1 ("Definitions") of the Agreement is amended to read as follows:
- "1.33 "Vendor Fee" means: (i) for performance of the Services during the base term (April 15, 2014 to April 14, 2019), the compensation specified in the Fee Schedule; and (ii) for performance of the Services during the extension period (April 15, 2019 to April 14, 2024), the compensation specified in the Extension Period Fee Schedule."
- 3. Amendment of Section 1. Subsection 1 ("Definitions") of the Agreement is amended by adding a new Subsection 1.37 to read as follows:
- "1.37 "Extension Period Fee Schedule" means the Vendor Fee payment schedule attached as Exhibit C-1."

- 4. Addition of Exhibit C-1. The attached Exhibit C-1 is added to the Agreement and incorporated by reference.
- 5. Effective Date. This Second Amendment shall be effective upon execution.
- 6. Preservation of Agreement. Except as expressly modified by this Second Amendment, all of the provisions of the Agreement (as amended by the First Amendment) shall remain unaltered and in full force and effect. In the event of a conflict between the provisions of this Second Amendment and the provisions of the Agreement (as amended by the First Amendment), the provisions of this Second Amendment shall control.

TO EFFECTUATE THIS SECOND AMENDMENT, the parties have caused their duly authorized representatives to execute this Second Amendment by signing below.

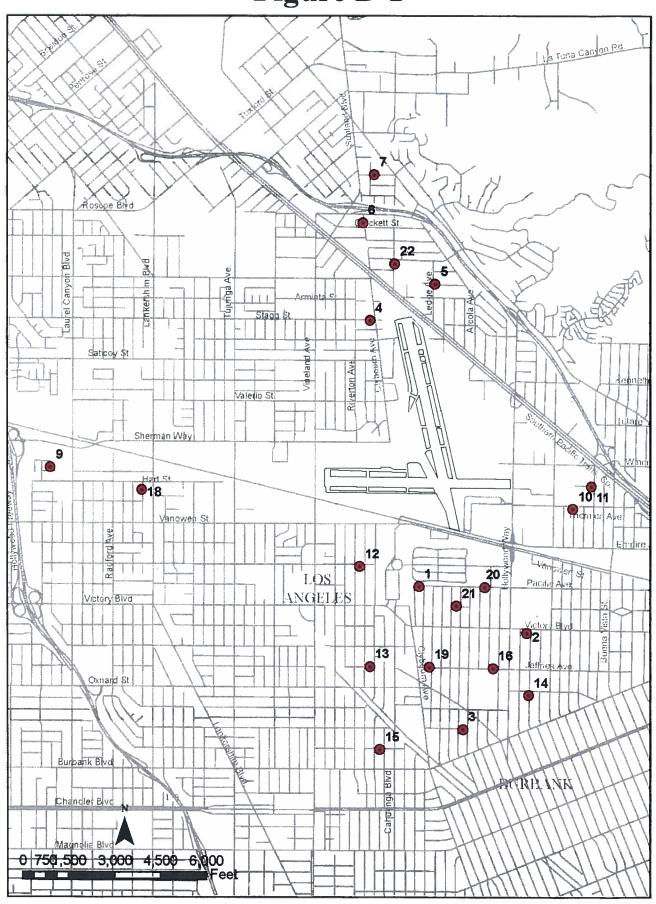
