- a. AWARD OF SEVENTH AMENDMENT FIXED BASE OPERATOR LEASE AND CONCESSION AGREEMENT TO VAN NUYS SKYWAYS, INC., DBA MILLION AIR BURBANK A staff report is included in the agenda packet. At the December 10, 2018, meeting of the Finance and Administration Committee ("Committee"), the Committee voted (2-0, one absent) to recommend the Commission approve a Seventh Amendment, copy attached, to the Fixed Base Operator and Concession Agreement with Van Nuys Skyways, Inc., dba Million Air Burbank, ("Million Air"). The proposed Seventh Amendment extends the terms of the Agreement for a five-year period to July 31, 2031, in exchange for a requirement to reimburse the Authority in the amount of \$208,000 for rehabilitation of Million Air's exclusive aviation ramp area. This area was previously under Authority responsibility and is included as a portion of the Authority's ongoing rehabilitation of the general aviation ramp being undertaken by the approved General Aviation Ramp Project E17-08.
- b. AWARD OF CONTRACT FOR AIRFIELD LIGHTING ELECTRICAL INSPECTION, TESTING AND ON-CALL REPAIR SERVICES PROJECT NUMBER E18-11. A staff report is included in the agenda packet. Subject to the recommendation from the Operations and Development Committee at its meeting immediately preceding the Commission meeting, Staff seeks approval from the Commission to award a contract, copy attached, for a two-year period in the amount of \$313,242 (\$156,621 annually) to Vellutini Corporation dba Royal Electric Company ("Royal Electric") for monthly airfield lighting testing and inspection services. This contract also includes rates for on-call repair and emergency services as needed and approved by Staff.

Staff will brief the Commission on the results of the Airport Council International North America's Marketing and Communication Conference "Excellence in Airport Marketing, Communications, and Customer Service Awards" for 2018. There are 20 awards bestowed on airports which "recognizes the quality of work, abundance of talent, and creativity within marketing, communications and customer service field of the airport industry." For 2018, ACI-NA received more than 300 entries for the 20 awards which include the "Peggy G. Hereford" award, which recognizes overall creativity in communicating an airport's message, effectiveness in connecting with audiences, and the overall scope of an airport's effort in marketing and public relations.
- c. NOVEMBER 2018 PARKING REVENUE STATISTICS. No staff report attached. Staff will present parking revenue data for the month of November 2018.
- d. NOVEMBER 2018 TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANIES ("TNC"). No staff report attached. Staff will update the Commission on TNC activity for the month of November 2018.
- e. NOVEMBER 2018 PASSENGER\CARGO AND REGIONAL AIRPORT PASSENGER STATISTICS. A staff report is included in the agenda packet. The November 2018 passenger count of 479,719 is up 7.9% over the previous year of 444,800. The calendar year-to-date (January-November 2018), the Airport has had approximately 4.8 million passengers which is an increase of 11.29% compared to the same period the year before. Air carrier operations increased by 5.32% for the month and cargo volume was 2.09% less when compared to last year's activity. Calendar year-to-date cargo volume has increased by 1.50% for a total of 100,055,473 pounds carried.

Staff recommended that the Committee recommend to the Commission that it exercise the second of the one-

The cost of the shuttle service was not included in the adopted FY 2019 budget. Staff is currently seeking alternate funding sources to support the shuttle service; however, if other funding sources are not obtained, a budget amendment may be required in the future.

Staff recommended that the Committee recommend to the Commission issuance of a Purchase Order to SP+ in the amount of \$3,340 per month for ondemand shuttle services between the Airport and the Burbank Airport - North Metrolink Station and authorization for the Executive Director to issue the same.

In response to changes in the activity levels of these tenants, staff undertook a Safety Risk Assessment ("SRA") of the aircraft activity between their operations. This project included: installation of a new HVAC system; replacement of the existing wet sprinklers with a pre-action dry sprinklers system; installation of a fire suppression system; installation of clean-room specific ceiling tiles; sealing of all entry points for cables and conduits to meet the airtightness requirements of the new fire suppression system; installation of Title 24 specific lighting and necessary changes to certain electrical components.

The Stone Collector was given notice to proceed with an expected project duration of 90 calendar days. However, the contractor was placed on hold the third week of June 2017, due to the need to evaluate changes to the project scope in response to the discovery of unanticipated electrical issues and additional

Staff presented to the Commission for approval an Airport Conveyance Equipment Services Agreement ("Agreement") to Elevators Etc. LP ("Elevators Etc.") for preventative maintenance services, on-call repair services, and emergency repair services for six elevators, two escalators, and six moving walkways located throughout the Airport. The Agreement will be for a three-year period with two one-year extension options available to the Authority. For preventative maintenance services during the three-year base term, the annual fee will be \$78,594 totaling to \$235,782 for the three-year period. The contract also includes rates for on-call repair and emergency services.

In September 2018, Staff issued a Request for Proposals ("RFP") for the inspection, preventative maintenance, on-call repair, and emergency repair services for elevators, escalators and moving walkways. Proposals were received from two firms: Elevators Etc., and Excelsior Elevator, the current services provider.

At the meeting of the Operations and Development Committee ("Committee") held immediately prior to the Commission meeting, the Committee voted unanimously (3–0) to recommend the Commission approve this item.

NOTES TO SCHEDULE OF CASH RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS MONTH AND THREE MONTHS ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 2018 & 2017

#### NOTE (5) - Rental Receipts - Other Buildings

Other Buildings rental receipts exceed the budget FYTD September due to the timing of receipts. Accrual basis Other Building receipts are \$119,345 ahead of budget FYTD September.

#### NOTE (6) - Ground Transportation

This category consists of off-airport access fees and TNC activity. Ground Transportation receipts exceed the budget FYTD September. Accrual basis ground transportation receipts are \$137,332 ahead of budget FYTD September primarily due to TNC activity.

#### NOTE (7) - Other Receipts

This category consists primarily of film location revenues. Accrual basis Other Receipts are \$212,504 ahead of budget FYTD September.

#### NOTE (8) - Investment Receipts - Treasurer

This line item represents cash received from the investment of funds. These receipts fluctuate in response to interest rate and portfolio balance changes and the timing of coupon payments and individual investment maturities and sales. Accrual basis investment income, including the interest earned on loans to Rent-A-Car Companies, exceeds the budget by \$209,623 FYTD September.

#### NOTE (9) - Cash Disbursements from Operations

Overall operating disbursements are favorably under budget FYTD September. On an accrual basis operating disbursements are favorably within budget parameters. See additional information on operating disbursements in notes 10 through 16.

Under the terms of the Bond Indenture, as amended, all CFCs collected subsequent to July 1, 2014 The debt service on the 2012 Revenue Bonds and the repayment to the Authority of the loans to the Rent-A-Car Companies ("RACs") is payable from are remitted to the Bond Trustee for the 2012 Bond debt service.

On July 1, 2014, the terms and conditions of the Non-Exclusive Concession and Lease Agreement with the respective Rent-A-Car Companies became effective, including the collection of Facility Rent.

## Note (1) - Customer Facility Charge ("CFC") Receipts

CFCs of \$6 per day per transaction, up to a maximum of five days, are collected and applied to the 2012 Bond debt service. CFCs received FYTD September exceeded the budget due to better than expected car rental activity

## Note (2) - Facility Rent

Facility Rent exceeds the budget FYTD September due to the timing of receipts.


## Note (3) - Loan Principal Repayments to the Authority

In the event of a shortfall of receipts to meet the required payment obligations (i.e., CFC collections perform under budget projections), the Authority hotds the right to adjust the Facility Rent paid by the rental car companies on a 30-day notice.

### AWARD OF SEVENTH AMENDMENT FIXED BASE OPERATOR LEASE AND CONCESSION AGREEMENT TO VAN NUYS SKYWAYS, INC., dba MILLION AIR BURBANK

#### <u>SUMMARY</u>

At the December 10, 2018, meeting of the Finance and Administration Committee ("Committee"), the Committee voted unanimously (3-0) to recommend the Commission approve a Seventh Amendment, copy attached, to the Fixed Base Operator and Concession Agreement with Van Nuys Skyways, Inc., dba Million Air Burbank, ("Million Air"). The proposed Seventh Amendment extends the terms of the Agreement for a five-year period to July 31, 2031, in exchange for a requirement to reimburse the Authority in the amount of \$208,000 for rehabilitation of Million Air's exclusive aviation ramp area. This area was previously under Authority responsibility and is included as a portion of the Authority's ongoing rehabilitation of the general aviation ramp being undertaken by the approved General Aviation Ramp Project E17-08.

#### BACKGROUND

With the termination of the then Fixed Based Operator ("FBO") Media Aviation, Million Air stepped in and has since served as one of two FBO operations at the Airport since 2003. In addition to providing FBO services, Million Air was granted the ability to be the exclusive general services provider to the Clybourn Complex Hangar Area (Hangars 37 – 45).

Million Air currently leases 6,817 square feet of terminal space on the first floor of Building 36; 1,942 square feet of storage space adjacent to Hangar 34; 139,392 square feet of ramp space for aircraft parking; and 3,678 square feet of fuel truck parking ramp space. The rent for these four areas is currently \$572,910.72 per year.

Based on its fifteen-year history with the Authority, during which it has consistently been a tenant in good standing, Staff negotiated with Million Air the proposed Seventh Amendment. The proposed Seventh Amendment will extend the term of the Agreement for these same services in exchange for Million Air's capital investment by way of reimbursing the Authority for the area that became part of the exclusive ramp. The ramp area to be rehabilitated was recently granted to Million Air on August 2018 under the Sixth Amendment to the Agreement. At that time, Staff was undertaking the programing for the rehabilitation of the general aviation ramp under the General Aviation Ramp Project E17-08. To ensure standardization of the rehabilitation of the entire general aviation ramp area, Staff initiated discussions with Million Air to either participate in the current project or undertake it a later date albeit at a higher cost. As it is in the best interest of both parties that the rehabilitated condition of the ramp area be standard, Million Air agreed to reimburse the Authority the

#### SEVENTH AMENDMENT TO FIXED BASE OPERATOR LEASE AND CONCESSION AGREEMENT

This SEVENTH AMENDMENT TO FIXED BASE OPERATOR LEASE AND CONCESSION AGREEMENT (the "Seventh Amendment") is dated as of \_\_\_\_\_\_\_. 2019 and is entered into by and between the BURBANK-GLENDALE-PASADENA AIRPORT AUTHORITY, a public entity formed under a joint exercise of powers agreement among the Cities of Burbank. Glendale and Pasadena, California, pursuant to the California Joint Exercise of Powers Act ("Landlord") and VAN NUYS SKYWAYS. INC., a California corporation (dba "Million Air Burbank") ("Tenant").


- A. Landlord and Tenant entered into a Fixed Base Operator Lease and Concession Agreement dated July 7, 2003 and amended it by a First Amendment dated November 17, 2003, a Second Amendment dated April 17, 2006, a Third Amendment dated February 11, 2010, a Fourth Amendment dated April 30, 2011, and a Fifth Amendment dated November 17, 2014 and a Sixth Amendment to Fixed Base Operator Lease and Concession Agreement dated August 20, 2018 (the "Lease"). Capitalized terms used but not defined in this Seventh Amendment shall have the meaning set forth in the Lease.
- B. Landlord and Tenant desire to extend the term of the Lease, permit Landlord to make certain improvements to the ramp space that is part of the Leased Premises, and provide for Tenant to reimburse Landlord for costs of such ramp improvements.

THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Extension Term.</u> Section 4.1 of the Agreement and Section 2. Term. of the First Amendment are hereby amended to read in full as follows:
  - "4.1 Term: Commencement Date: Expiration Date: Annual Period.

The initial term of this Agreement shall continue until 11:59 p.m. on July 31. 2031 ("Expiration Date"), unless the term is earlier terminated by Authority pursuant to Section 4.3 or otherwise, in which case, the last day of the extended term or the date of such termination shall be the "Expiration Date." Each twelve (12) full calendar month period from August 31 of a calendar year to July 31 of the following calendar year during the term of this Agreement shall be referred to in this Agreement as an "Annual Period."

- 2. Rent. During such extension. Annual Base Rent shall continue to be adjusted as described in Section 5.1.2 of the Lease.
- 3. Ramp Improvements. Landlord shall complete the ramp improvements described on Exhibit "A" hereto to the ramp space included in the Leased Premises on or before January 21, 2019, subject to delays beyond the control of Landlord.
- 4. <u>Cost Reimbursement</u>. Tenant shall pay Landlord, without deduction or offset, the sum of \$208,000 for the ramp improvements within thirty (30) business days after written demand from Landlord given after the completion of the ramp improvements described in

#### AWARD OF CONTRACT FOR AIRFIELD LIGHTING ELECTRICAL INSPECTION, TESTING AND ON-CALL REPAIR SERVICES PROJECT NUMBER E18-11

#### SUMMARY

Subject to the recommendation of the Operations and Development Committee at its meeting immediately preceding the Commission meeting, Staff seeks Commission approval to award a contract, copy attached, for a two-year period in the amount of \$313,242 (\$156,621 annually) to Vellutini Corporation, dba Royal Electric Company ("Royal Electric"), for monthly airfield lighting testing and inspection services. This contract also includes rates for on-call repair and emergency services as needed and approved by Staff.

#### **BACKGROUND**

An operational airfield lighting system is critical to the success and safety of the Airport's daily operations. The FAA provides detailed guidance on best practices associated with testing, inspection and preventative maintenance activities for different components of a typical airport's airfield lighting system. While the Authority's Maintenance Department provides the preventative maintenance and undertakes certain necessary repairs to the airfield lighting system, Staff believes that obtaining the services of a qualified electrical contractor that has expertise with airfield lighting systems will ensure stricter compliance with recommendations that are issued by the FAA, as well as improve the reliability and longevity of the existing system.

#### PROJECT DETAILS

The scope of the proposed services was developed with the support of the engineering consulting firm Mead & Hunt, which has expertise and significant experience in airfield lighting testing, inspection and preventative maintenance programs. The recommendations from Mead & Hunt were reviewed by the Engineering and Maintenance department. With the consultant's support, the guidance provided by the FAA was reviewed, and it was determined which specific tasks would be more appropriate for a qualified electrical contractor to undertake. The frequency and complexity of the task were considered as part of Staff's assessment as well as adequacy of our current adherence with the recommended frequency. For example, daily tasks were excluded from the proposed contractor's scope as it would be inefficient for them to provide daily services as these recommended daily tasks are adequately completed by the Maintenance Department. Also, tasks associated with the standby emergency generators for the airfield lighting system are already under a service contract and completed on a semi-annual basis by an outside vendor. As such, this service requirement was also excluded from the scope of the proposed contract.

Improving implementation of the FAA guidance is a primary reason to obtain these services and Staff feels it is prudent to having a qualified electrical contractor with expertise in airfield lighting systems that is intimately familiar with the Authority's Airport airfield lighting system on an on-call basis in case of an unexpected issue or emergency.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW**

Staff has reviewed the California Environmental Quality Act guidelines regarding exemptions applicable to this work and determined that this work is exempt pursuant to the Class 1 categorical exemption (14 C.C.R. § 15301). Among other things, that exemption covers rehabilitation of deteriorated facilities to meet current standards of public health and safety in situations where damage is not substantial and has not resulted from an environmental hazard.

#### **BUDGET IMPACTS**

The Adopted FY 2019 Budget includes appropriations for this work at \$300,000.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

Subject to the recommendation from the Operations and Development Committee at its meeting immediately preceding the Commission meeting, Staff seeks approval from the Commission to award a contract in the amount of \$313,242 (\$156,621 annually) to Vellutini Corporation, dba Royal Electric Corporation, for the defined airfield lighting testing and inspection scope to be completed on a monthly basis for a two-year period and authorize the President to execute the same.


