Staff presented a report seeking recommendation to the Commission that it authorize an Award of Contract for Landside Paving Rehabilitation in the amount of \$157,400 to PALP, Inc., dba Excel Paving Company, a not-to-exceed amount of \$20,000 for construction management, administration and quality assurance testing services, and a project contingency in the amount of \$17,000 for unforeseen circumstances. Appropriations in the amount of \$250,000 are included in the adopted FY 2019 budget (Landside Paving

Replacement).

The scope of work includes removing and replacing the existing asphalt in three separate locations where spot repairs are no longer effective. These locations are Avenue A, Avenue B and the shuttle parking area adjacent to the Federal Aviation Administration ("FAA") Air Traffic Control Tower. The total area of asphalt to be replaced is approximately 43,000 square feet.

The work will begin after the award and execution of the contract and is scheduled to be completed within forty-five (45) calendar days after a notice to proceed is issued to the contractor.

Commissioner Brown moved approval of Staff's recommendation, seconded by Commissioner Devine.

Student Art – "Tower
Banner" Contest Presentation of Winning

Entries

For the 12th consecutive year, the Airport Authority held its Student Art Tower Banner Contest, inviting art students in grades nine through twelve in the school districts of Burbank, Glendale and Pasadena to prepare banner designs based on the theme "Heroes of Aviation." A total of 172 entries were received and evaluated from all three school districts. Each school nominated the top three entries from its own students to be entered in a final round of judging. The arts and culture

commissions of the three cities judged the three finalists from their respective cities and made the final decision awarding 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners.

The finalists' artwork from all three school districts, as well as the runner-up entries, were presented to the Commission, and the student artists who created the banners were also present, along with their faculty advisors.

Staff noted that since the inception of the contest a total of \$31,500 has been awarded to each school district to supplement its art education program. The Authority awards an additional \$3,000 to each school district bringing the total to \$34,500.

The 1st place winning entries from each district will have their artwork displayed on the of the Hollywood Burbank Airport tower for approximately 3 months during the upcoming year. All artwork will be displayed in the Terminal B.

Award of Contract for Landside Paving Rehabilitation – Project Number E18-17 With the recommendation of the Operations and Development Committee at its meeting on April 1, 2019, Staff presented to the Commission a request for approval of an Award of Contract for Landside Paving Rehabilitation in the amount of \$157,400 to PALP, Inc., dba Excel Paving Company; approval to authorize a project budget for construction management, administration and quality assurance testing services for a not-to-exceed amount of \$20,000; and authorization for a project aggregate contingency of \$17,000 for unforeseen circumstances that may arise during the course of construction.

Pavements throughout the Airport are inspected annually and pavement in three areas was determined to need replacement or rehabilitation. These areas include a shuttle parking lot adjacent to the Federal Aviation Administration ("FAA") tower, sections of the Avenue A entrance road, and sections of Avenue B. The total area of asphalt to be replaced is approximately 43,000 sq. ft.

After publicly soliciting bids on the Authority's PlanetBids e-procurement website, Staff determined the low bidder to be PALP, Inc., dba Excel Paving with a bid of \$157,400. Excel

Paving has recently performed satisfactory work at Hollywood Burbank Airport.

b. Amendment No. 1 to **Professional Services** Agreement – Universal Protection Service LP dba Allied Universal for **Additional Traffic Control** Services

At the Operations and Development Committee ("Committee") meeting held immediately prior to the Commission meeting, the Committee voted (2-0, one absent) to recommend that the Commission approve the proposed Amendment No. 1 for Professional Services Agreement ("Agreement") with Universal Protection Service LP dba Allied Universal ("Allied") for Additional Traffic Control Services.

The approval of this Agreement provides additional traffic control services specifically to coordinate the Transportation Network Company ("TNC") activities at Hollywood Burbank Airport. TNC activities at the Airport have grown steadily since their introduction and are expected to increase based on the current summer schedule of the airlines.

The proposed Amendment is for a term of 18 months beginning May 1, 2019, to coincide with the original three (3) year term of the Agreement for an amount no-to-exceed \$220,500. The Agreement provides one additional traffic officer per eight hour shift, two shifts per day. seven days a week, including holidays with a total of two positions. The funding for these positions will be provided through the recently approved increase to the TNC loading and unloading fees of from \$3.00 to \$3.50.










NOTES TO SCHEDULE OF CASH RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS MONTH AND EIGHT MONTHS ENDED FEBRUARY 28, 2019 & 2018

General Comments

The Schedule of Cash Receipts and Disbursements ("Schedule") represents the cash basis activity for the month and fiscal year-to-date ("FYTD") compared to the allocation of the annual adopted budget.

The Schedule consists of two sections: Operating Activity and Facility Improvement/Noise Mitigation Transactions. Receipts are shown as positive amounts and disbursements as negative amounts. Favorable budget variances are shown as positive amounts and unfavorable variances as negative amounts. Because this Schedule is on a cash basis, cash timing differences may contribute to budget variances.

The Operating Activity receipts include charges for services (parking, landing fees and concessions), tenant rents, fuel flowage fees, other revenues and investment receipts. The Operating Activity disbursements include costs of services, materials, contracts, personnel and debt service.

Facility Improvement / Noise Mitigation Transactions represent the activity for the Authority's capital program, which consists of the Sound Insulation Program and Other Facility Improvement Program Projects.

The FY 2019 Capital Program expenditures are primarily funded by the following sources:

- FAA-approved Passenger Facility Charge ("PFC") program receipts/reserves;
- Grants:
- Facility Development Funds (Authority Reserves).

The notes below provide additional information regarding the performance results detailed in the "Schedule of Cash Receipts and Disbursements."

A Supplemental Schedule of Cash Receipts and Disbursements reflecting the activities related to the Series 2012 Bond debt service and repayment to the Authority of the loans provided to the Rent-A-Car Companies ("RACs") for the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center / Consolidated Rental Car Facility is also presented.

NOTE (1) - Cash Receipts from Operations

Cash receipts from operations are ahead of budget FYTD February. On an accrual basis, operating revenues are favorably ahead of budget FYTD February by \$3,061,004. See notes 2 through 8 for additional information regarding operating receipts.

NOTE (2) - Landing/Fuel Fees

Landing fees are based on landed weight of the aircraft. Fuel fees are charged at a rate of \$0.05 a gallon to non-signatory air carriers for fuel loaded at BUR. The landing fee component of this category is trending under budget primarily due to the one year incentive fee waiver provided on flights to new destinations. On an accrual basis, when combined with the positive fuel flowage fee performance, this category is under budget FYTD February by \$3,154.

NOTE (3) - Parking Fees

Parking fee revenues are performing ahead of the budget forecast. Accrual basis parking fees are \$568,153 ahead of budget FYTD February.

NOTE (4) - Rental Receipts - Terminal Building

Terminal Building rental receipts exceed the budget FYTD February due to the timing of receipts and additional concession revenues received above the minimum annual guarantee. Accrual basis terminal building rents are \$643,134 ahead of budget FYTD February. The positive FYTD February passenger growth of 8.35% has contributed to achieving the favorable performance results.

NOTE (5) - Rental Receipts - Other Buildings

Other Buildings rental receipts are under budget FYTD February due to the timing of receipts. Accrual basis Other Building receipts are \$258,619 ahead of budget FYTD February.

NOTE (6) - Ground Transportation

This category consists of off-airport access fees and TNC activity. Ground Transportation receipts exceed the budget FYTD February. Accrual basis ground transportation receipts are \$433,385 ahead of budget FYTD February primarily due to TNC activity.

NOTE (7) - Other Receipts

FYTD February Other Receipts include a rent deposit of \$329,098 from Star Aviation for the lease of Hangar 22 which was awarded by the Commission in October 2018 and an insurance reimbursement of \$146,475 to repair the roof of Hangar 2 which was damaged by the wind last fiscal year (April 2018). In February, the Airport received an insurance reimbursement of \$290,330 which will be refunded in March to Deluxe for their relocation to another facility while repair was performed on the roof of Hangar 2. Accrual basis Other Receipts are \$358,733 ahead of budget FYTD February.

NOTE (8) - Investment Receipts - Treasurer

This line item represents cash received from the investment of funds. These receipts fluctuate in response to interest rate and portfolio balance changes and the timing of coupon payments and individual investment maturities and sales. Accrual basis investment income, including the interest earned on loans to Rent-A-Car Companies, exceeds the budget by \$802,134 FYTD February.

NOTE (9) - Cash Disbursements from Operations

Overall operating disbursements are favorably under budget FYTD February. On an accrual basis operating disbursements are favorably within budget parameters. See additional information on operating disbursements in notes 10 through 16.

NOTE (10) - Administrative Supplies & Costs

This line item includes office supplies, printing, postage and delivery, office equipment service and lease, recruiting, membership, uniform, Commission meeting, conference and training costs.

NOTE (11) - Operating Supplies & Maintenance

This line item includes utilities, fuel, general repairs and maintenance, landscaping, supplies and telephone costs.

NOTE (12) - Contractual Operating Costs

This line item includes various contractual operating costs such as ARFF services, janitorial services, systems and vehicle repair, parking operations and the TBI Airport Management contract costs.

NOTE (13) - Contractual Professional Services

This line item includes various professional services such as legal, auditing, noise, financial and insurance.

NOTE (14) - Wages and Benefits

Wages and Benefits consist of payroll and fringe benefit costs for the Airport Police officers, and include the impact of the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding effective February 2017. Wages and benefits include overtime for film location services which are recovered through the related film revenue.

NOTE (15) - Other Operating Costs

This line item includes public relations/advertising, air service retention, license and permits and bad debt expense.

NOTE (16) - Parking Tax

The 12% City of Burbank parking tax is paid quarterly for the prior three-month period. The next remittance, covering parking activity for the months of January, February and March 2019, is due April 2019.

NOTE (17) - Sound Insulation Program

The Sound Insulation program is funded primarily through FAA Airport Improvement Program ("AIP") grants and and Passenger Facility Charge ("PFC") revenues. In December 2016, the FAA issued a Record of Approval on the Part 150 Study which has recently been recertified by FAA. Staff is awaiting FAA's decision to award a noise discretionary grant, the receipt of which will facilitate the restart of the program.

NOTE (18) - Other Facility Improvement Program Projects

Other Facility Improvement Program Projects costs are under budget FYTD February by \$2,597,176 due to the timing of expenditures of certain projects.

NOTE (19) - FAA Grants - Other Facility Improvement Program Projects

FAA Grants are budgeted to partially fund the Taxiway C & D, GA Ramp Rehabilitation Project and Land Acquisition of Hollyona Property.

NOTE (20) - Other Grants

Other grants represent federal grants, other than FAA AIP grants, and local grants that fund or partially fund the Ground Access Study.

NOTE (21) - Passenger Facility Charge Receipts/Reserves

A number of capital projects are budgeted to be funded or partially funded by Passenger Facility Charges, including the Taxiway C & D and GA Ramp Rehabilitation Project, Terminal Ramp Rehabilitation and and Airfield Lighting System Rehabilitation.

NOTE (22) - Facility Development Fund (Authority Reserves)

The FY 2019 adopted budget programmed the use of Authority Reserves as a funding source for the airport share of Replacement Terminal Project.

General Comments

The debt service on the 2012 Revenue Bonds and the repayment to the Authority of the loans to the Rent-A-Car Companies ("RACs") is payable from Customer Facility Charges ("CFCs") and Facility Rents. Under the terms of the Bond Indenture, as amended, all CFCs collected subsequent to July 1, 2014 are remitted to the Bond Trustee for the 2012 Bond debt service.

On July 1, 2014, the terms and conditions of the Non-Exclusive Concession and Lease Agreement with the respective Rent-A-Car Companies became effective, including the collection of Facility Rent.

Note (1) - Customer Facility Charge ("CFC") Receipts

CFCs of \$6 per day per transaction, up to a maximum of five days, are collected and applied to the 2012 Bond debt service. CFCs received FYTD February exceeded the budget due to better than expected car rental activity.

Note (2) - Facility Rent

Facility Rent exceeds the budget FYTD February due to the timing of receipts.

Note (3) - Loan Principal Repayments to the Authority


Repayments of the loan principal to the Authority from the Rent-A-Car Companies exceed the budget FYTD February due to timing of receipts. The principal portion of the payment will be deposited as reimbursement to the Authority's Facility Development Fund. The interest portion of the loan repayment is recorded as investment income.

Note (4) - Net RITC / ConRAC Facility Payments and Collections

A positive amount in this line indicates that cash has been received above the required payment obligations. At fiscal year-end, upon conclusion of the required reconciliation, any excess surplus accumulated will be evaluated and applied toward the allowed uses under the terms and conditions of the Non-Exclusive Concession and Lease Agreement with the Rent-A-Car Companies.

In the event of a shortfall of receipts to meet the required payment obligations (i.e., CFC collections perform under budget projections), the Authority holds the right to adjust the Facility Rent paid by the rental car companies on a 30-day notice.

SECOND AMENDMENT TO AIRPORT ACCESS AND FACILITIES USE AGREEMENT UBER TECHNOLOGIES, INC.

SUMMARY

At the April 29, 2019, special meeting of the Finance and Administration Committee ("Committee"), the Committee voted unanimously (3–0) to recommend that the Commission approve the proposed Amendment No. 2 to the Airport Access and Facilities Use Agreement ("Agreement"), copy attached, dated April 15, 2019, to recognize the change of name of the Transportation Network Company ("TNC") serving the Hollywood Burbank Airport from Raiser-CA, LLC, (formerly Raiser-CA, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company) to Uber Technologies, Inc. ("Uber"), a Delaware corporation.

BACKGROUND

On September 6, 2016, an Airport Access and Facilities Use Agreement for Airport Transportation Network Company Services ("Agreement") was awarded to Rasier-CA, LLC.

Effective February 4, 2019, the California Public Utilities Commission granted to Uber Technologies, Inc., a permit to operate as a TNC in the State of California, copy attached. With the grant of this permit, Uber submitted a request to reflect the name change under the Agreement. Uber has advised staff that all principals, owners and key employees remain and that request for an amendment to the Agreement is to only reflect the change of name. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement remain unchanged and in full force.

IMPACT ON REVENUE

The proposed Second Amendment is revenue neutral to the Authority.

RECOMMENDATION

At the April 29, 2019, special meeting of the Finance and Administration Committee ("Committee"), the Committee voted unanimously (3–0) to recommend that the Commission approve the proposed Amendment No. 2 to the Airport Access and Facilities Use Agreement, dated April 15, 2019, to reflect the change of name from Raiser-CA, LLC, to Uber Technologies, Inc., and authorize the President of the Authority to execute same.

AMENDMENT NO. 2 TO AIRPORT ACCESS AND FACILITIES USE AGREEMENT

Class VIII Operators

THIS AMENDMENT NO. 2 ("Second Amendment") to the September 6, 2016 Airport Access and Facilities Use Agreement ("Agreement") executed by the Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority, a California joint powers agency ("Authority"), and Uber Technologies, Inc., a Delaware corporation (formerly Rasier-CA, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company) ("Operator"), is dated April 15, 2019 for reference purposes. Capitalized terms used in this Second Amendment but not defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed in the Agreement.

RECITALS

- A. The parties executed the Agreement to provide for the Authority's grant to Operator of a Commercial Access License that will provide Drivers with authorized access to designated portions of the Hollywood Burbank Airport for commercial purposes, including the right to use the Airport roads and designated facilities for transportation of passengers and their baggage by car.
- B. Operator has changed its corporate name and status from Rasier-CA, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, to Uber Technologies, Inc., a Delaware corporation.
- C. The parties desire to amend the Agreement in order to reflect the change in Operator's name and corporate status.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Operator's Corporate Status and Name Change. Anywhere in the Agreement where there is a reference to the name "Rasier-CA, LLC" or "Rasier-CA, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company," such reference shall be replaced with the name "Uber Technologies, Inc." or "Uber Technologies, Inc., a Delaware corporation."
- **2. Definition of "Operator."** The term "Operator" in the Agreement shall hereafter refer to Uber Technologies, Inc., a Delaware corporation.
- 3. Binding Effect. The Agreement's rights and obligations, as amended by the First Amendment, are hereafter binding upon Uber Technologies, Inc., a Delaware corporation.
- 4. Effective Date. This First Amendment shall be effective as of April 1, 2019.
- 5. Preservation of Agreement. Except as expressly modified by the First Amendment and this Second Amendment, all of the provisions of the Agreement shall remain unaltered and in full force and effect. In the event of a conflict between the provisions of this Second Amendment and the provisions of the Agreement, the provisions of this Second Amendment shall control.

The above-named Carrier, having made written application to the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California for a permit to operate as a CHARTER-PARTY CARRIER OF PASSENGERS, TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY, pursuant to Sections 5351 through 5443 of the Public Utilities Code and Commission Decisions 13-09-045, 14-04-022 and 14-11-043, is granted this permit authorizing the transportation of passengers by motor vehicle over the public highways of the State of California as a CHARTER-PARTY CARRIER OF PASSENGERS, TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANY, as defined in said Code and decisions, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) This permit is issued pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 5384(b), and Decision 13-09-045.
- (2) The requirements and status of your issued TNC permit may change pending determinations the Commission may make in Rulemaking 12-12-011 or a successor proceeding.
- (3) Said Carrier shall comply with the insurance requirements of Public Utilities Code Section 5433 and Decision 14-11-043.
- (4) All transportation must be prearranged through the use of an online-enabled application or platform.
- (5) Said Carrier shall comply with all Commission orders, decisions, rules, directions, and requirements governing the operations of said Carrier, including Decisions 13-09-045, 14-04-022 and 14-11-043, and shall remit to the Commission the Transportation Reimbursement Fee required by Public Utilities Code Section 403.
- (6) This permit is subject to amendment, modification, suspension or revocation as provided in the Public Utilities Code and in Commission Resolutions PE-498, PE-501, and TL-18336.
- (7) This permit may not be sold, assigned, leased, or otherwise transferred or encumbered without Commission authorization.
- (8) This permit does not authorize the Carrier to conduct operations on the property of or into any airport unless such operation is authorized by the airport authority involved.
- (9) This permit authorizes Carrier to facilitate rides between passengers and private drivers using their own personal vehicles. "Personal vehicle" means the vehicle for which the authorized TNC driver is the registered owner (with the Department of Motor Vehicles), or of which the authorized TNC driver has a legal right to possess the vehicle, pursuant to Public Utilities Code Section 5362, Vehicle Code Sections 460 and 370, as these code sections currently exist and may be revised, and any other relevant laws.
- (10) A TNC is not permitted to itself own vehicles used in its operation or own fleets of vehicles.
- (11) The use of top lights and/or taxi meters in all vehicles operated under this permit is prohibited (Decision 82-05-069). This permit does not authorize the street hailing of passengers.
- (12) This permit expires February 4, 2022. It may be renewed every three (3) years upon submission and approval of a renewal application. This renewal application should be submitted 90-days prior to the expiration date.

AIRLINE SCHEDULE ANALYSIS

Alaska Airlines has notified Staff of the following changes in service, fleet mix, and scheduled operating times for Hollywood Burbank Airport. This report reflects the changes in detail below and on the attached Schedule Change Analysis.

ALASKA AIRLINES

Effective, April 30, 2019, Alaska Airlines made an adjustment to its schedule by adding one daily round-trip flight to Portland per week. Concurrently, Alaska eliminated one Saturday round-trip flight to Seattle per week.

OVERALL IMPACT

After incorporating this schedule adjustment, these changes to schedule results in an increase of 12 additional weekly operations. The schedule change also results in an increase of 708 weekly seats or a 0.47% greater from the prior schedule. This revised schedule has a combined total for all carriers of 150,040 available weekly seats.






