#### 6. ITEMS FOR COMMISSION APPROVAL

- a. AWARD OF HANGAR LEASE HANGAR 38. A staff report is included in the agenda packet. At the July 15, 2019 meeting of the Finance and Administration Committee ("Committee"), the Committee voted unanimously (3–0) to recommend the Commission approve an Aviation Hangar Lease between Avalon Capital Group, Inc., and the Authority for Hangar 38, which seeks a lease of three years with an option for one three-year extension for the purpose of storing aircraft at Hollywood Burbank Airport.
- b. MONTH-TO-MONTH OFFICE LEASE UNITED MAINTENANCE COMPANY, INC. A staff report is included in the agenda packet. Staff seeks Commission approval for a month-to-month office space lease with United Maintenance Company, Inc. ("United Maintenance"). United Maintenance was recently awarded the contract to provide janitorial services to the Authority and will utilize the office space as a break room area for its employees as well as support space for its on-site manager. Normally, such a lease would first be presented to the Finance and Administration Committee. However, due to the transition between the two companies, to be completed on August 31/September 1, Staff is bringing this to the Commission directly to support the change in service providers.
- c. CHANGE ORDER SUPERIOR LIFE SUPPORT INC. FOR MEDICAL DIRECTOR OVERSITE SERVICES. A staff report is included in the agenda packet. Subject to the recommendation of the Operations and Development Committee at its meeting immediately preceding the Commission meeting, Staff seeks Commission approval

for a Change Order in the amount of \$10,000 with Superior Life Support Inc. for medical director oversite services required to implement the Airport Fire Department's initiation of a Narcan and EpiPen program. These programs, mandated by the Los Angeles County Department of Health Services Emergency Medical Services Agency, are part of the scope of practice for Emergency Medical Technicians effective July 1, 2019. These two programs require medical director oversite by a licensed physician

d. WASTE HAULING AND RECYCLING SERVICES CONTRACT AWARD. A staff report is included in the agenda packet. Subject to the recommendation of the Operations and Development Committee at its meeting immediately preceding the Commission meeting, Staff seeks Commission approval to award a Waste Hauling and Recycling Services contract to American Reclamation Inc. for a three-year term commencing October 1, 2019 and extending to September 30, 2022 at an initial fixed monthly fee of \$10,573 with an allowance for on-call services of \$1,500 per month. The contract also contains two one-year options at the Authority's discretion, prices subject to adjustment.

The Art in Public Places requirement for the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center has yet to be achieved. Staff has met with the city representatives responsible for the program and researched alternatives which would meet the requirements. Staff will present to the Commission the results of its research and present a recommendation to fulfill the goal of the program.
- b. JUNE 2019 PARKING REVENUE STATISTICS. No staff report attached. Staff will present parking revenue data for the month of June 2019.
- c. JUNE 2019 TRANSPORTATION NETWORK COMPANIES. No staff report attached. Staff will update the Commission on TNC activity for the month of June 2019.
- d. AIRLINE SCHEDULE ANALYSIS AND JUNE 2019 PASSENGER/CARGO AND REGIONAL AIRPORT PASSENGER STATISTICS. A staff report is included in the agenda packet. The June 2019 passenger count of 520,215 was up 15.6% compared to last year's 450,025 passengers. Air carrier aircraft operations increased 21.84% while cargo volume in June was slightly down at 8.6 million pounds.

Changes to the airline schedule result in a decrease of 40 round-trip flights a week with an increase of 1,372 weekly seats, primarily due to changes in equipment to

larger aircraft. This revised schedule has a combined total of 187,536 available weekly seats for all carriers.

4. Contract and Leases

a. Task Order Authorization for Escalator Rehabilitation

**Elevators Etc. LP** 

Staff presented to the Committee and requested recommendation to the Commission for the authorization of two task orders in the total amount of \$171,406 to Elevators Etc. LP ("Elevators Etc.") for the rehabilitation of the two escalators in the "North Tower" section of the elevated walkway to the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center ("RITC").

Staff noted that the escalator rehabilitation will be paid through the available CFC construction fund. Therefore there will be no impact to the FY 2019 or proposed FY 2020 budget.

Staff reported that based on information collected while performing preventative maintenance services. Elevators Etc. identified the need to complete a thorough rehabilitation of both escalators in the "North Tower." The escalators were originally installed and commissioned in 2014 and to date have not received a thorough cleaning by either of the two previous service providers. The proposed rehabilitation includes removing all steps, adjustment and realignment of the track, complete cleaning of the escalator interior throughout the entire escalator length, flushing the gearbox, replacing the oil, replacing the step chains, and installing new steps. The state-issued permits for both escalators are renewed annually, with the current permits set to expire on August 22, 2019 and November 13, 2019. Staff will instruct Elevators Etc. to complete the work in advance of the permit expiration dates.

Commissioner Devine moved approval of Staff's recommendation, seconded by Commissioner Brown.

The motion was approved unanimously (3-0).

Staff presented to the Committee a request for recommendation to the Commission that it authorize the issuance of purchase orders to SITA for the acquisition and installation of ten additional common use kiosks in the amount of \$172,299, including sales tax; Shires Electric for the installation of the electric power for each kiosk in the amount of \$8,400; and Future Design Communication for the installation of data lines for each kiosk in the amount of \$3,227.

Staff also recommended an additional \$10,000 in project contingency in the event of unforeseen circumstances for a total proposed project cost of \$193,926.

At the May 23, 2019, Airline Airport Affairs Committee meeting, the airlines were presented the estimated cost to acquire, install and maintain ten additional kiosks for the ticket lobbies with the airlines voting in favor of the proposal.

Under the terms of the Airport Use Agreement, the airlines are fully responsible for the cost of any additional equipment as well as the installation and maintenance cost. The additional equipment and installation will initially be funded utilizing Authority funds subject to immediate reimbursement of all project related costs by each airline based on their agreed to cost-sharing formula. There will be no impact to the FY 2019 or proposed FY 2020 budget.

b. Amendment No. 1 to the Professional Services Agreement – Trifiletti Consulting Inc. At the June 17, 2019 meeting of the Legal, Government and Environmental Affairs Committee ("Committee"), the Committee voted (2–0) to recommend that the Commission approve an Amendment No. 1 to the Professional Services Agreement ("PSA") with

Trifiletti Consulting Inc. ("Trifiletti") for continued support services with environmental, entitlement, land use, sustainability and governmental advisory services in support of the proposed Replacement Passenger Terminal project.

In August 2018, the Authority entered into a PSA with Trifiletti in the amount of \$60,000 to assist staff in discussions with the Southern California Air Quality Management District regarding environmental clearances support services for the proposed Replacement Passenger Terminal project.

In December 2018, Staff requested Trifiletti's support to expedite Staff's efforts with two programs necessary to qualify for U.S. DOT Credit Programs, specifically, the potential loan program through Build America Bureau.

The Amendment would increase the contract value by \$55,000, for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$115,000, and would authorize an additional one-year extension of the contract term.

c. Award of Contracts – Taxiway A Rehabilitation Project Number E18-20 At the Operations and Development Committee ("Committee") meeting held immediately prior to the Commission meeting, the Committee voted unanimously (3–0) to recommend the Commission authorize four separate actions with regard to the rehabilitation of Taxiway A, the primary commercial taxiway with access to Runway 15-33: i) Award a construction contract in the amount of \$2,099,920 to Sully-Miller Contracting Company ("Sully-Miller") for the

Taxiway Alpha ("Taxiway A") Rehabilitation Project; (ii) Award of a professional services agreement in the lump sum amount of \$108,725 to RDM International, Inc. ("RDM") for engineer of record construction administration services, onsite technical services, and material testing; (iii) Approve a project budget amount for construction management, contract administration and field observation in an amount not-to-exceed \$75,000; and, (iv) Approve a project contingency of \$150,000 for any unforeseen conditions that may arise during construction.

The Authority's adopted "race conscious" Disadvantaged Business Enterprise ("DBE") program and guidelines were incorporated into the construction bid documents. The triennial DBE Program Goal is 13%; however, the DBE goal established for this specific project was 24.86%, which Sully-Miller met with a 25.27% participation commitment.

As the designer of record, RDM will provide engineer of record construction administration services, onsite technical services, materials testing services and FAA Acceptance Testing Summary reporting.

Azrial Consulting, the Authority's on-call CAD service provider, will provide AutoCAD and site reference services.

Construction of the project will require nightly closures of Taxiway A. These nightly closures will be limited to the time between 10:30 p.m. – 6:30 a.m. and the taxiway will be re-opened for use each morning.

Commissioner Tornek moved the motion; seconded by Commissioner Wiggins.

d. Award of Contract – Janitorial Services

At the Operations and Development Committee ("Committee") meeting held immediately prior to the Commission meeting, the Committee voted unanimously (3-0) to recommend the Commission approve an award of a Janitorial Services contract to United Maintenance Company, Inc. ("United Maintenance"), for a three-year period, at a fixed price of \$4,248,390.32, excluding supplies. The proposed agreement also includes two one-year extension options with a fixed annual cost of \$1,498,765.42 and \$1,529,959.97, respectively. Supplies to be provided are to be billed monthly on an actual cost basis which, based on current activity levels, are estimated to be approximately \$18,000 per month.

In February 2019, nine firms responded to a publicly advertised Request for Proposal ("RFP") for janitorial maintenance service. After an initial review, two of the proposals were deemed non-responsive. After further reviews by an evaluation panel composed of five staff members, the remaining proposals were evaluated resulting in four firms being invited to an interview for further consideration.

On May 6, 2019, Staff sought the Committee's recommendation for a contract award to DFS. At that meeting, the Committee asked Staff to clarify the evaluation and selection process, as well as the significant discrepancy in proposed monthly hours and price amongst the short-listed firms. To address the concerns raised by the Committee, Staff utilized a two-step "Best and Final Offer" ("BAFO") process with all the four short-listed firms.

Since the evaluation process continued past the expiration date of then current Janitorial Services Agreement, Staff negotiated a contract amendment with Diverse Facility Solutions, Inc. ("DFS"), the current janitorial service provider, for a month-to-month extension not to exceed three months to allow for completion of the

BAFO process. The Commission approved this contract amendment on May 20, 2019.

Evaluation of the submitted BAFOs resulted in Staff announcing on June 6, 2019, a plan to recommend a contract award to United Maintenance at the June 17, 2019, Committee and Commission meetings.

On July 3, 2019, DFS, which was one of the four short-listed firms, submitted a letter protesting Staff's announced plan to recommend contract award to United Maintenance. The protest letter claimed that United Maintenance had not obtained current wage and benefit information or committed to a collective bargaining agreement.

Before the vote was taken, John Csehill, a representative of United Maintenance, announced that he had received word during the meeting that a signed agreement had been reached with the janitorial worker's union SEIU-USWW, increasing the current wages and benefits and committing to a collective bargaining agreement.

Ada Camacho, a representative of SEIU-USWW, commented on Item 7.d.

**MOTION** 

Commissioner Tornek moved the motion; seconded by Commissioner Gharpetian. The Commission requested that the confirmation of the vote would be subject to the validity of the signed agreement between United Maintenance and the SEIU-USWW.

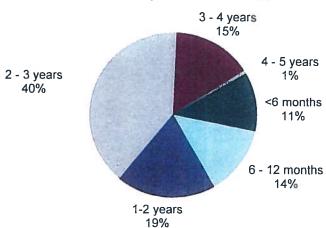

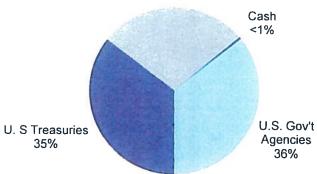

### **Sector Allocation**





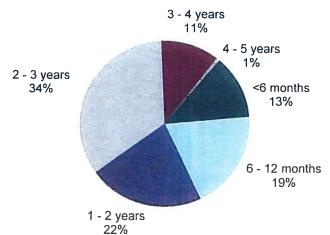

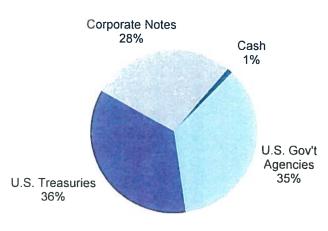

#### **General Comments**

The Schedule of Cash Receipts and Disbursements ("Schedule") represents the cash basis activity for the month and fiscal year-to-date ("FYTD") compared to the allocation of the annual adopted budget.

The Schedule consists of two sections: Operating Activity and Facility Improvement/Noise Mitigation Transactions. Receipts are shown as positive amounts and disbursements as negative amounts. Favorable budget variances are shown as positive amounts and unfavorable variances as negative amounts. Because this Schedule is on a cash basis, cash timing differences may contribute to budget variances.

The Operating Activity receipts include charges for services (parking, landing fees and concessions), tenant rents, fuel flowage fees, other revenues and investment receipts. The Operating Activity disbursements include costs of services, materials, contracts, personnel and debt service.

Facility Improvement / Noise Mitigation Transactions represent the activity for the Authority's capital program, which consists of the Sound Insulation Program and Other Facility Improvement Program Projects.

The FY 2019 Capital Program expenditures are primarily funded by the following sources:

- FAA-approved Passenger Facility Charge ("PFC") program receipts/reserves;
- Grants:
- Operating Revenues;
- Facility Development Funds (Authority Reserves).

The notes below provide additional information regarding the performance results detailed in the "Schedule of Cash Receipts and Disbursements."

A Supplemental Schedule of Cash Receipts and Disbursements reflecting the activities related to the Series 2012 Bond debt service and repayment to the Authority of the loans provided to the Rent-A-Car Companies ("RACs") for the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center / Consolidated Rental Car Facility is also presented.

#### NOTE (1) - Cash Receipts from Operations

Cash receipts from operations are ahead of budget FYTD May. On an accrual basis, operating revenues are favorably ahead of budget FYTD May by \$4,860,535. See notes 2 through 8 for additional information regarding operating receipts.

#### NOTE (2) - Landing/Fuel Fees

Landing fees are based on landed weight of the aircraft. Fuel fees are charged at a rate of \$0.05 a gallon to non-signatory air carriers for fuel loaded at BUR. The landing fee component of this category is trending under budget primarily due to the one year incentive fee waiver provided on flights to new destinations. On an accrual basis, when combined with the positive fuel flowage fee performance, this category exceeds the budget FYTD May by \$4,273.

#### NOTE (3) - Parking Fees

Parking fee revenues are performing ahead of the budget forecast. Accrual basis parking fees are \$621,468 ahead of budget FYTD May.

#### NOTE (4) - Rental Receipts - Terminal Building

Terminal Building rental receipts exceed the budget FYTD May due to the timing of receipts and additional concession revenues received above the minimum annual guarantee. Accrual basis terminal building rents are \$1,115,617 ahead of budget FYTD May. The positive FYTD May passenger growth of 8.64% has contributed to achieving the favorable performance results.

#### NOTE (5) - Rental Receipts - Other Buildings

Other Buildings rental receipts are under budget FYTD May due to the timing of receipts. Accrual basis Other Building receipts are \$512,904 ahead of budget FYTD May.

# NOTE (6) - Ground Transportation

This category consists of off-airport access fees and TNC activity. Ground Transportation receipts exceed the budget FYTD May. Accrual basis ground transportation receipts are \$789,368 ahead of budget FYTD May primarily due to TNC activity.

# NOTE (7) - Other Receipts

FYTD May Other Receipts include a rent deposit of \$329,098 from Star Aviation for the lease of Hangar 22 which was awarded by the Commission in October 2018 and an insurance reimbursement of \$146,475 to repair the roof of Hangar 2 which was damaged by the wind last fiscal year (April 2018). Accrual basis Other Receipts are \$493,047 ahead of budget FYTD May.

# NOTE (8) - Investment Receipts - Treasurer

This line item represents cash received from the investment of funds. These receipts fluctuate in response to interest rate and portfolio balance changes and the timing of coupon payments and individual investment maturities and sales. Accrual basis investment income, including the interest earned on loans to Rent-A-Car Companies, exceeds the budget by \$1,323,858 FYTD May.

#### NOTE (9) - Cash Disbursements from Operations

Overall operating disbursements are favorably under budget FYTD May. On an accrual basis operating disbursements are favorably within budget parameters. See additional information on operating disbursements in notes 10 through 16.

# NOTE (10) - Administrative Supplies & Costs

This line item includes office supplies, printing, postage and delivery, office equipment service and lease, recruiting, membership, uniform, Commission meeting, conference and training costs.

# NOTE (11) - Operating Supplies & Maintenance

This line item includes utilities, fuel, general repairs and maintenance, landscaping, supplies and telephone costs.

# NOTE (12) - Contractual Operating Costs

This line item includes various contractual operating costs such as ARFF services, janitorial services, systems and vehicle repair, parking operations and the TBI Airport Management contract costs.

# NOTE (13) - Contractual Professional Services

This line item includes various professional services such as legal, auditing, noise, financial and insurance.

# NOTE (14) - Wages and Benefits

Wages and Benefits consist of payroll and fringe benefit costs for the Airport Police officers, and include the impact of the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding effective February 2017. Wages and benefits include overtime for film location services which are recovered through the related film revenue.

#### NOTE (15) - Other Operating Costs

This line item includes public relations/advertising, air service retention, license and permits and bad debt expense.

# NOTE (16) - Parking Tax

The 12% City of Burbank parking tax is paid quarterly for the prior three-month period. The next remittance, covering parking activity for the months of April, May & June 2019, is due July 2019.

# NOTE (17) - Sound Insulation Program

The Sound Insulation program is funded primarily through FAA Airport Improvement Program ("AIP") grants and and Passenger Facility Charge ("PFC") revenues. In December 2016, the FAA issued a Record of Approval on the Part 150 Study which has recently been recertified by FAA. Staff is awaiting FAA's decision to award a noise discretionary grant, the receipt of which will facilitate the restart of the program.

# NOTE (18) - Other Facility Improvement Program Projects

Other Facility Improvement Program Projects costs are under budget FYTD May by \$5,723,488 due to the timing of expenditures of certain projects.

# NOTE (19) - FAA Grants - Other Facility Improvement Program Projects

FAA Grants are budgeted to partially fund the Taxiway C & D, GA Ramp Rehabilitation Project and Land Acquisition of Hollyona Property.

# NOTE (20) - Other Grants

Other grants represent federal grants, other than FAA AIP grants, and local grants that fund or partially fund the Ground Access Study.

# NOTE (21) - Passenger Facility Charge Receipts/Reserves

A number of capital projects are budgeted to be funded or partially funded by Passenger Facility Charges, including the Taxiway C & D and GA Ramp Rehabilitation Project, Terminal Ramp Rehabilitation and and Airfield Lighting System Rehabilitation.

# NOTE (22) - Facility Development Fund (Authority Reserves)

The FY 2019 adopted budget programmed the use of Authority Reserves as a funding source for the airport share of Replacement Terminal Project.

#### General Comments

The debt service on the 2012 Revenue Bonds and the repayment to the Authority of the loans to the Rent-A-Car Companies ("RACs") is payable from Customer Facility Charges ("CFCs") and Facility Rents. Under the terms of the Bond Indenture, as amended, all CFCs collected subsequent to July 1, 2014 are remitted to the Bond Trustee for the 2012 Bond debt service.

On July 1, 2014, the terms and conditions of the Non-Exclusive Concession and Lease Agreement with the respective Rent-A-Car Companies became effective, including the collection of Facility Rent.

### Note (1) - Customer Facility Charge ("CFC") Receipts

CFCs of \$6 per day per transaction, up to a maximum of five days, are collected and applied to the 2012 Bond debt service. CFCs received FYTD May exceeded the budget due to better than expected car rental activity.

#### Note (2) - Facility Rent

Facility Rent exceeds the budget FYTD May due to the timing of receipts.

#### Note (3) - Loan Principal Repayments to the Authority

Repayments of the loan principal to the Authority from the Rent-A-Car Companies exceed the budget FYTD May due to timing of receipts.

The principal portion of the payment will be deposited as reimbursement to the Authority's Facility Development Fund. The interest portion of the loan repayment is recorded as investment income.

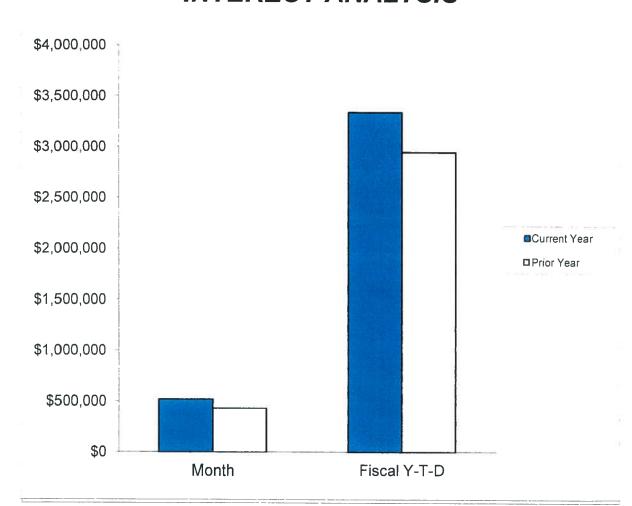
# Note (4) - Net RITC / ConRAC Facility Payments and Collections

A positive amount in this line indicates that cash has been received above the required payment obligations. At fiscal year-end, upon conclusion of the required reconciliation, any excess surplus accumulated will be evaluated and applied toward the allowed uses under the terms and conditions of the Non-Exclusive Concession and Lease Agreement with the Rent-A-Car Companies.

In the event of a shortfall of receipts to meet the required payment obligations (i.e., CFC collections perform under budget projections), the Authority holds the right to adjust the Facility Rent paid by the rental car companies on a 30-day notice.

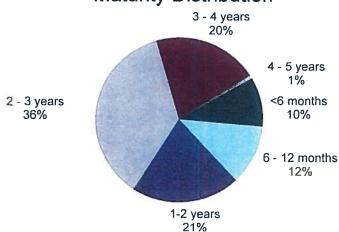

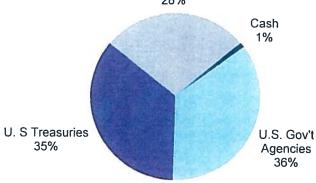

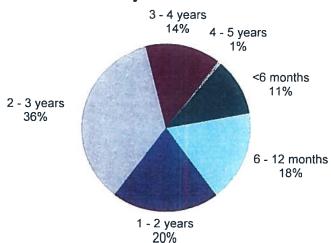




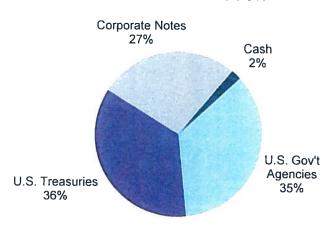

# NOTES TO SCHEDULE OF CASH RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS MONTH AND TEN MONTHS ENDED APRIL 30, 2019 & 2018

#### **General Comments**

The Schedule of Cash Receipts and Disbursements ("Schedule") represents the cash basis activity for the month and fiscal year-to-date ("FYTD") compared to the allocation of the annual adopted budget.

The Schedule consists of two sections: Operating Activity and Facility Improvement/Noise Mitigation Transactions. Receipts are shown as positive amounts and disbursements as negative amounts. Favorable budget variances are shown as positive amounts and unfavorable variances as negative amounts. Because this Schedule is on a cash basis, cash timing differences may contribute to budget variances.

The Operating Activity receipts include charges for services (parking, landing fees and concessions), tenant rents, fuel flowage fees, other revenues and investment receipts. The Operating Activity disbursements include costs of services, materials, contracts, personnel and debt service.

Facility Improvement / Noise Mitigation Transactions represent the activity for the Authority's capital program, which consists of the Sound Insulation Program and Other Facility Improvement Program Projects.

The FY 2019 Capital Program expenditures are primarily funded by the following sources:

- FAA-approved Passenger Facility Charge ("PFC") program receipts/reserves;
- Grants;
- Operating Revenues:
- Facility Development Funds (Authority Reserves).

The notes below provide additional information regarding the performance results detailed in the "Schedule of Cash Receipts and Disbursements."

A Supplemental Schedule of Cash Receipts and Disbursements reflecting the activities related to the Series 2012 Bond debt service and repayment to the Authority of the loans provided to the Rent-A-Car Companies ("RACs") for the Regional Intermodal Transportation Center / Consolidated Rental Car Facility is also presented.

# NOTE (1) - Cash Receipts from Operations

Cash receipts from operations are ahead of budget FYTD April. On an accrual basis, operating revenues are favorably ahead of budget FYTD April by \$4,140,081. See notes 2 through 8 for additional information regarding operating receipts.

# NOTE (2) - Landing/Fuel Fees

Landing fees are based on landed weight of the aircraft. Fuel fees are charged at a rate of \$0.05 a gallon to non-signatory air carriers for fuel loaded at BUR. The landing fee component of this category is trending under budget primarily due to the one year incentive fee waiver provided on flights to new destinations. On an accrual basis, when combined with the positive fuel flowage fee performance, this category is under budget FYTD April by \$7,868.

#### NOTE (3) - Parking Fees

Parking fee revenues are performing ahead of the budget forecast. Accrual basis parking fees are \$599,790 ahead of budget FYTD April.

# NOTE (4) - Rental Receipts - Terminal Building

Terminal Building rental receipts exceed the budget FYTD April due to the timing of receipts and additional concession revenues received above the minimum annual guarantee. Accrual basis terminal building rents are \$906,499 ahead of budget FYTD April. The positive FYTD April passenger growth of 8.42% has contributed to achieving the favorable performance results.

#### NOTE (5) - Rental Receipts - Other Buildings

Other Buildings rental receipts are under budget FYTD April due to the timing of receipts. Accrual basis Other Building receipts are \$425,253 ahead of budget FYTD April.

#### NOTE (6) - Ground Transportation

This category consists of off-airport access fees and TNC activity. Ground Transportation receipts exceed the budget FYTD April. Accrual basis ground transportation receipts are \$606,738 ahead of budget FYTD April primarily due to TNC activity.

### NOTE (7) - Other Receipts

FYTD April Other Receipts include a rent deposit of \$329,098 from Star Aviation for the lease of Hangar 22 which was awarded by the Commission in October 2018 and an insurance reimbursement of \$146,475 to repair the roof of Hangar 2 which was damaged by the wind last fiscal year (April 2018). Accrual basis Other Receipts are \$445,930 ahead of budget FYTD April.

# NOTE (8) - Investment Receipts - Treasurer

This line item represents cash received from the investment of funds. These receipts fluctuate in response to interest rate and portfolio balance changes and the timing of coupon payments and individual investment maturities and sales. Accrual basis investment income, including the interest earned on loans to Rent-A-Car Companies, exceeds the budget by \$1,163,739 FYTD April.

# NOTE (9) - Cash Disbursements from Operations

Overall operating disbursements are favorably under budget FYTD April. On an accrual basis operating disbursements are favorably within budget parameters. See additional information on operating disbursements in notes 10 through 16.

# NOTE (10) - Administrative Supplies & Costs

This line item includes office supplies, printing, postage and delivery, office equipment service and lease, recruiting, membership, uniform, Commission meeting, conference and training costs.

# NOTE (11) - Operating Supplies & Maintenance

This line item includes utilities, fuel, general repairs and maintenance, landscaping, supplies and telephone costs.

# NOTE (12) - Contractual Operating Costs

This line item includes various contractual operating costs such as ARFF services, janitorial services, systems and vehicle repair, parking operations and the TBI Airport Management contract costs.

# NOTE (13) - Contractual Professional Services

This line item includes various professional services such as legal, auditing, noise, financial and insurance.

# NOTE (14) - Wages and Benefits

Wages and Benefits consist of payroll and fringe benefit costs for the Airport Police officers, and include the impact of the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding effective February 2017. Wages and benefits include overtime for film location services which are recovered through the related film revenue.

#### NOTE (15) - Other Operating Costs

This line item includes public relations/advertising, air service retention, license and permits and bad debt expense.

#### NOTE (16) - Parking Tax

The 12% City of Burbank parking tax is paid quarterly for the prior three-month period. April 2019 remittance, in the amount of \$529,222, covers parking activity for the months of January, February and March 2019. The next remittance, covering parking activity for the months of April, May & June 2019, is due July 2019.

#### NOTE (17) - Sound Insulation Program

The Sound Insulation program is funded primarily through FAA Airport Improvement Program ("AIP") grants and and Passenger Facility Charge ("PFC") revenues. In December 2016, the FAA issued a Record of Approval on the Part 150 Study which has recently been recertified by FAA. Staff is awaiting FAA's decision to award a noise discretionary grant, the receipt of which will facilitate the restart of the program.

#### NOTE (18) - Other Facility Improvement Program Projects

Other Facility Improvement Program Projects costs are under budget FYTD April by \$4,412,998 due to the timing of expenditures of certain projects.

#### NOTE (19) - FAA Grants - Other Facility Improvement Program Projects

FAA Grants are budgeted to partially fund the Taxiway C & D, GA Ramp Rehabilitation Project and Land Acquisition of Hollyona Property.

#### NOTE (20) - Other Grants

Other grants represent federal grants, other than FAA AIP grants, and local grants that fund or partially fund the Ground Access Study.

# NOTE (21) - Passenger Facility Charge Receipts/Reserves

A number of capital projects are budgeted to be funded or partially funded by Passenger Facility Charges, including the Taxiway C & D and GA Ramp Rehabilitation Project, Terminal Ramp Rehabilitation and and Airfield Lighting System Rehabilitation.

#### NOTE (22) - Facility Development Fund (Authority Reserves)

The FY 2019 adopted budget programmed the use of Authority Reserves as a funding source for the airport share of Replacement Terminal Project.

#### **General Comments**

The debt service on the 2012 Revenue Bonds and the repayment to the Authority of the loans to the Rent-A-Car Companies ("RACs") is payable from Customer Facility Charges ("CFCs") and Facility Rents. Under the terms of the Bond Indenture, as amended, all CFCs collected subsequent to July 1, 2014 are remitted to the Bond Trustee for the 2012 Bond debt service.

On July 1, 2014, the terms and conditions of the Non-Exclusive Concession and Lease Agreement with the respective Rent-A-Car Companies became effective, including the collection of Facility Rent.

# Note (1) - Customer Facility Charge ("CFC") Receipts

CFCs of \$6 per day per transaction, up to a maximum of five days, are collected and applied to the 2012 Bond debt service. CFCs received FYTD April exceeded the budget due to better than expected car rental activity.

#### Note (2) - Facility Rent

Facility Rent exceeds the budget FYTD April due to the timing of receipts.

# Note (3) - Loan Principal Repayments to the Authority

Repayments of the loan principal to the Authority from the Rent-A-Car Companies exceed the budget FYTD April due to timing of receipts.

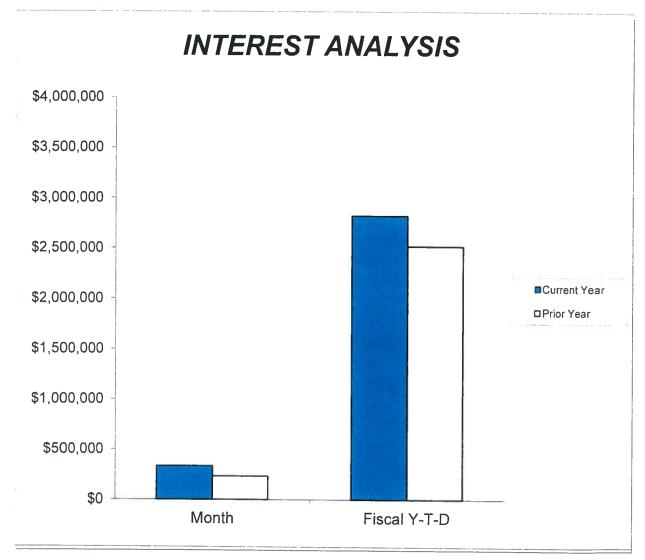
The principal portion of the payment will be deposited as reimbursement to the Authority's Facility Development Fund. The interest portion of the loan repayment is recorded as investment income.

# Note (4) - Net RITC / ConRAC Facility Payments and Collections

A positive amount in this line indicates that cash has been received above the required payment obligations. At fiscal year-end, upon conclusion of the required reconciliation, any excess surplus accumulated will be evaluated and applied toward the allowed uses under the terms and conditions of the Non-Exclusive Concession and Lease Agreement with the Rent-A-Car Companies.

In the event of a shortfall of receipts to meet the required payment obligations (i.e., CFC collections perform under budget projections), the Authority holds the right to adjust the Facility Rent paid by the rental car companies on a 30-day notice.

# AWARD OF AVIATION HANGAR LEASE HANGAR 38

# SUMMARY

At the July 15, 2019, meeting of the Finance and Administration Committee ("Committee"), the Committee voted unanimously (3–0) to recommend that the Commission approve the award of an Aviation Hangar Lease ("Lease") between the Avalon Capital Group, Inc. ("Avalon") and the Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority ("Authority") for Hangar 38, copy attached. Avalon seeks a lease term of three years with an option for one three-year extension for the purpose of storing aircraft at Hollywood Burbank Airport.

# **BACKGROUND**

Avalon is a privately held investment company with diverse interests, including public and private investments in real estate, technology, health care, finance and entertainment. The aircraft to be stored is owned by Avalon for its business use. Avalon has the financial resources to meet the obligations of the proposed hangar lease.

Avalon, currently a tenant at Van Nuys Airport, would like to relocate to Hollywood Burbank Airport. Their current fleet consists of one Global Express XRS aircraft. Effective April 1, 2020, Avalon expects to replace this aircraft with a new and larger Global 7500 aircraft. If approved, Avalon will relocate its base of operation of the aircraft to Hangar 38.

# **DETAILS**

The proposed Lease is for a term of three years with one three-year extension and includes a Tenant Improvement Allowance of up to \$167,349 in the form of rent credit for Authority approved tenant improvements to the facility. In order for the rent credit to be applicable, it can be only be used for Authority approved tenant improvements and the improvements must occur within the first twelve months from the date of Lease commencement.

Avalon proposes to undertake its tenant improvements construction during the first three months of the lease, with their aircraft remaining at Van Nuys Airport until the improvements are completed. During the construction, rent will not be assessed. However, rent will become effective on December 1, 2019, regardless whether the tenant improvements are completed or not. Based on the amount of space to be utilized for the Global XRS aircraft, Avalon will remit from December 2019 through March 2020 at \$23,616 per month. Upon delivery of the larger Global 7500 aircraft, currently scheduled for April 2020, the rental rate will be increased to reflect the additional space Avalon will require to house the new aircraft.

Key components of the proposed Lease are:

Premises: Hangar 38 (located in the northwest quadrant of the Airport)

Use: Storage of general aviation aircraft

Term: September 1, 2019 through August 31, 2022

Option: One three-year extension

Rent: September 1, 2019 – November 20, 2019 rent abatement during construction

Effective December 1, 2019: \$23,616 per month Effective April 1, 2020: \$26,455 per month

Adjustments: Greater of three percent (3%) per year or 120% of CPI, not to exceed 6%

annually

Rent Credit: \$167,349 upon completion of Authority approved tenant improvements

by June 1, 2020

Other: Tenant responsible for expenses related to occupancy including

maintenance, utilities, share of property insurance and applicable taxes

# REVENUE IMPACT

If the tenant improvements are completed with the first 3 months of the lease as planned, with the application of the full rental credit the first year's rental revenue will be de minimis. For each succeeding year thereafter, the base revenue will be the base year rent of \$317,460 plus applicable rent adjustments as described above.

# RECOMMENDATION

At the July 15, 2019, meeting of the Finance and Administration Committee ("Committee"), the Committee voted unanimously (3–0) to recommend that the Commission approve the proposed Aviation Hangar Lease with Avalon for Hangar 38 and authorize the President to execute the same.

# MONTH-TO-MONTH OFFICE LEASE UNITED MAINTENANCE COMPANY, INC.

# SUMMARY

Staff seeks Commission approval for a month-to-month office space lease with United Maintenance Company, Inc. ("United Maintenance"). United Maintenance was recently awarded the contract to provide janitorial services to the Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority ("Authority") and will utilize the office space as a break room area for its employees as well as support space for its on-site manager.

# BACKGROUND

On July 15, 2019, the Authority awarded a Janitorial Services Agreement to United Maintenance for a three-year period, with two one-year extension options. United Maintenance will begin providing janitorial services effective September 1, 2019.

This lease is for the same office space leased to the previous provider of janitorial services and will be utilized in a similar manner. Subject to the award of contract for janitorial services, Staff did not pursue preparing a month-to-month lease until a decision on the service provider was completed. With the change in janitorial services provider, Staff prepared the proposed month-to-month lease and is bringing it directly to the Commission for its consideration to support the transition from the previous service providers whose lease will expire on August 31, 2019 to United Maintenance.

# **DESCRIPTION**

The proposed lease is for a 261 square foot office space located on the second floor of Building 9 and, as previously mentioned, is currently occupied by the previous provider of janitorial services. The rate for this space is based on the rates and charges applicable to the airlines which, other than airport staff, are the main tenants in Building 9. The purpose of the space will remain the same and there will be no impact to the revenue generated by the previous lease to the proposed lease. A copy of the proposed month-to-month office lease is attached.

# CHANGE ORDER SUPERIOR LIFE SUPPORT INC. FOR MEDICAL DIRECTOR OVERSITE SERVICES

#### SUMMARY

Subject to the recommendation of the Operations and Development Committee ("Committee") at its meeting immediately preceding the Commission meeting, Staff seeks Commission approval for a Change Order in the amount of \$10,000 with Superior Life Support Inc. ("SLS") for medical director oversite services required to implement the Airport Fire Department's initiation of a Narcan and EpiPen program. These programs, mandated by the Los Angeles County Department of Health Services Emergency Medical Services Agency, are part of the scope of practice for Emergency Medical Technicians ("EMT") effective July 1, 2019. These two programs require medical director oversite by a licensed physician.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The two programs to be deployed by the Authority's Airport Fire Department ("AFD") are Narcan Nasal Spray for use to treat an opioid overdose by blocking or reversing the effects of opioids and Epinephrine ("Epi") Pen Injectors used to treat severe allergic reactions and/or asthma attacks.

SLS currently is AFD's service provider for the Authority's Automated External Defibrillator ("AED") and "Stop the Bleed" programs. The services from SLS include supplies, instruction/training and oversight. These services, under a three-year purchase order, are in their last year and expire on May 30, 2020. The current annual cost of these two programs is \$16,866. The cost to add a licensed physician to provide medical director oversight for the Narcan and EpiPen programs is \$10,000, increasing the annual cost to \$26,866 excluding the cost of the Narcan and EpiPen inventory. The cost for the initial inventory of Narcan and EpiPens for adult and juvenile doses is \$1,510.

Working in conjunction with UCLA Center for Prehospital Care ("UCLA"), the provider of the Authority's EMS training, SLS was able to identify a licensed physician that is capable of and willing to serve as the medical director to oversee these two programs for the Authority. Dr. Ira Howard Tillis, M.D., has over 30 years of emergency medicine experience and is currently the Assistant Medical Director and EMS Liaison for the Simi Valley Hospital and Medical Center.

If this additional program is approved, the total cost of services to meet the LA County oversight requirement, starting from June 1, 2017 through May 30, 2020 for all programs, will amount to \$87,480.

#### **DETAILS**

The Los Angeles County Department of Health Services Emergency Medical Services Agency requires that first responder personnel involved in these two programs undergo training and certification on the use of Narcan Nasal Spray and EpiPen Injectors.

SLS, UCLA and Dr. Tillis have developed a training program for AFD personnel that will (1) meet all State regulations and EMS Agency Policies and (2) receive LA County's Department of Health Services approval to be a public safety Narcan and EpiPen service provider. Under the services for Medical Director oversite, SLS and Dr. Tillis will:

- 1) Oversee programs;
- 2) Collect the required data and submit annual reports to the LA County Department of Health Services;
- 3) Review all cases where a Narcan or an EpiPen was utilized;
- 4) Review personnel and system performance; and
- 5) Make recommendations for modification of the system design, performance protocols or training standards designed to improve patient outcomes.

Additionally, in conjunction with UCLA, SLS and Dr. Tillis will assist AFD with compliance of EMS Agency policies and protocols. This team of medical specialist will also provide the written policy for the proper storage of Narcan Nasal Spray and EpiPen inventory.

#### **FUNDING**

Funding for the AED, Stop the Bleed and Narcan/ EpiPen programs are included in the adopted FY 2020 budget.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Subject to the recommendation of the Operations and Development Committee ("Committee") at its meeting immediately preceding the Commission meeting, Staff seeks Commission approval for a Change Order in the amount of \$10,000 to Superior Life Support Inc., for Medical Director oversight required by the Los Angeles County Department of Health Services Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency to implement a Narcan and EpiPen program at the Hollywood Burbank Airport.

### WASTE HAULING AND RECYCLING SERVICES CONTRACT AWARD

#### **SUMMARY**

Subject to the recommendation of the Operations and Development Committee at its meeting immediately preceding the Commission meeting, Staff seeks Commission approval to award a Waste Hauling and Recycling Services contract to American Reclamation Inc. ("American") for a three-year term commencing October 1, 2019 and extending to September 30, 2022 at an initial fixed monthly fee of \$10,573 with an allowance for on-call services of \$1,500 per month. The contract also contains two one-year options at the Authority's discretion, prices subject to adjustment.

This item is being resubmitted because, subsequent to the Operations and Development Committee ("Committee") decision on May 6, 2019 to recommend a contract award to American, the Authority received information that required Staff to reject all proposals and reissue the Request for Proposals ("RFP") for waste hauling and recycling services.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Authority's waste hauling and recycling needs are currently being met on a month to month basis by Athens Environmental Services, Inc. ("Athens") for properties in Burbank and by Republic Services, Inc. for properties in Los Angeles. As of March 1, 2019, the combined approximate average monthly cost for these services is \$23,182.33 (the amount fluctuates with the volume of on-call pickups driven by Maintenance Department projects).

Over the past several years, the provision of waste hauling and recycling services for the Authority has changed hands through mergers, acquisitions, and contract assignment from Crown Disposal, Inc. to Recology, Inc. to Athens. The original rates were honored by each of the new service providers as they assumed the obligations of the existing contract. Beyond industry consolidation impacting the service provider market, over the past number of years the Legislature has enacted several waste diversion and recycling laws that have impacted the service provider environment as providers worked to become compliant.

#### **PROCUREMENT**

#### A. Original Solicitation

On August 28, 2018, through the Authority's PlanetBids e-procurement website, Staff issued an RFP for waste hauling and recycling services. Despite significant interest in the RFP, only Athens submitted a proposal. Not counting on-call services, Athens proposed a monthly fee of \$23,251. As this price represented a near 100% increase from the rates and charges incurred over the past several years, Staff rejected the sole proposal.

After being notified of the rejection of its proposal and that the RFP would be reissued, Athens sent the Authority a fee increase notice. This notice stated that, effective March 1, 2019, Athens' rates and charges would increase to the amounts submitted in its rejected proposal.

#### B. Second Solicitation

Staff conducted follow-up interviews with firms that declined to provide a proposal and, following further internal review, Staff amended the Scope of Services in several areas to address some of the service providers' concerns. The changes were as follows:

- 1. Elimination of front-end loader scales
- 2. Affirmed that waste stream would remain "mixed", but, eliminated Materials Recovery Facility ("MRF") ownership requirement
- 3. Modified Notice of Violation language
- 4. Construction of a new three-bin storage area for cardboard packing materials

On February 28, 2019, Staff issued a revised RFP for waste hauling and recycling services. The revised RFP was re-advertised via PlanetBids, a second pre-proposal meeting was held, and five firms attended (including two that had not participated in the original solicitation). Proposals were received on March 29, 2019 and interviews were conducted on April 11, 2019. Among the most important requirements, responding firms were required to:

- Describe their approach, planning, and execution of waste hauling and recycling services including equipment, personnel, and schedule for picking up the bins including delivering replacement bins on an as needed basis.
- Assure that the Authority is and, always remains, compliant with all applicable laws, including Assembly Bills 341,1383 and 1826 regarding waste diversion requirements.

Two proposals were received and the proposed monthly fees, not including on-call services, were as follows:

American Reclamation, Inc.
 Athens Environmental Services, Inc.
 \$11,467.24
 \$17,582.83

#### C. Protest

On May 3, 2019, subsequent to the release of the agenda packet for the Committee's May 6<sup>th</sup> meeting, Athens submitted a letter protesting the RFP process and the proposed contract award to American. This letter followed a "notice of potential protest" submitted by Athens on April 25, 2019. Essentially, Athens' May 3<sup>rd</sup> letter asserted that American was unable to satisfy the RFP's requirement that refuse be sorted off-site for recyclable material prior to being sent to a landfill, and Athens reiterated that assertion in testimony to the Committee at the May 6<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Upon being informed of Athens' notice of potential protest, American submitted a May 1, 2019 letter reaffirming its ability to satisfy the recyclable material off-site site sorting

requirement. American also submitted a May 1, 2019 letter from the County Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County ("County Sanitation Districts"). In key part, the County Sanitation Districts' letter stated:

"As we previously discussed, the Puente Hills MRF is currently able to floor sort specific loads of MSW as long as this service is specifically requested by our customers in advance. If you have loads coming from a particular source, for example loads of MSW from Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport Authority and want all those loads sorted to separate and divert recyclables and organic waste from landfills prior to residual waste being transferred to the landfill, we can accommodate that request."

At the May 6, 2019 meeting, the Committee considered Staff's request for a recommendation to the Commission for a contract award to American. Staff and representatives from American addressed questions from the Committee, and the Committee unanimously approved Staff's request.

Subsequently, on May 8, 2019, the County Sanitation Districts informed Staff that the Puente Hills MRF is not be able to accept mixed waste refuse from the Authority, having high concentrations of organic material. The County Sanitation Districts indicated that, when the May 1, 2019 letter was issued, it did not know that the Authority's waste stream includes high percentages of organic waste from food and beverage concessions. As a result of this information, Staff deemed American's proposal non-responsive, rejected all proposals, and recommenced the RFP process.

#### D. Third Solicitation

A new RFP for waste hauling and recycling services was released on June 26, 2019. The new RFP included a revision that removed the requirement that each proposer notify and obtain the Authority's approval of the proposer's designated refuse and recycling facilities. Staff and counsel determined that this requirement did not have significant value considering the broad indemnity clause contained in the contract that will be executed by the selected firm. That clause requires the contractor to indemnify the Authority for claims arising from the contractor's negligence, willful misconduct, or failure to comply with the agreement or applicable law. As part of the new RFP, language was added to this clause to explicitly state that the contractor is required to indemnify the Authority for penalties imposed by the State of California for noncompliance with waste diversion requirements.

Four proposals were received; three were deemed responsive and one was deemed non-responsive. A proposal review committee consisting of five staff members reviewed the proposals in accordance with the selection criteria outlined in the RFP. Each proposal was scored out of 100 points based on the breakdown listed below:

SC-1 Firm Description, Capability and Suitability (10 points)

SC-2 Experience of Firm and Qualifications (15 points)

SC-3 Technical Approach (30 points)

SC-4 Consent to Services Agreement (10 points)

SC-5 Price (35 points)

Based on these results, Staff again recommends a contract award to American. The proposed contract is for a three-year fixed-rate term with two one-year options at the Authority's sole discretion. If the Authority exercises any of the option years, the applicable rate for each option year is subject to negotiation with American. The Authority may also terminate this contract for convenience upon thirty days written notice to American.

#### **FUNDING**

Funding for the first year of this service is included in the adopted FY 2020 budget. Funding for future years will be proposed in the annual budget process for O&M expenses.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Subject to the recommendation of the Operations and Development Committee at its meeting immediately preceding the Commission meeting, Staff seeks Commission approval to award a Waste Hauling and Recycling Services contract to American for a three-year term commencing on October 1, 2019 and extending to through September 30, 2022, with two one-year option periods at an initial fixed monthly fee of \$10,573 with an allowance for on-call services of \$1,500 per month.

#### AIRLINE SCHEDULE ANALYSIS

Airlines serving Hollywood Burbank Airport have notified Staff of changes in services, fleet mix, and scheduled operating times. This report reflects the changes in detail below and on the attached Schedule Change Analysis.

#### ALASKA

Effective, August 27, 2019, Alaska Airlines will be making an adjustment to its schedule by eliminating two daily round-trip flight, one to Portland and one to Seattle. Concurrently, Alaska will be adding one Saturday round-trip flight to San Jose per week. In addition, Alaska will be making an equipment adjustment by increasing the use of its larger A320 and B737-900 aircraft over the smaller Embraer 175 aircraft.

#### **AMERICAN**

Effective September 6, 2019, American Airlines will be making a schedule adjustment by eliminating five weekly round-trip flights to Phoenix. In addition, the carrier will be making an equipment adjustment by eliminating its A319 aircraft and adding its CRJ700 aircraft for this schedule.

#### **DELTA**

Effective, September 8, 2019, Delta will be making a schedule adjustment by adding one daily round-trip flight to Salt Lake City a week. Concurrently, Delta will be eliminating one Saturday round-trip flight to Atlanta per week.

#### **JETBLUE**

Effective September 5, 2019, jetBlue will be making an adjustment to its schedule by eliminating two round-trip flights to Boston, and two round-trip flights to New York per week.

#### SOUTHWEST

Effective August 6, 2019, Southwest Airlines made an adjustment to its schedule. The number of scheduled flight changes in arrivals and departures represent a net increase of 10 round-trip flights per week, as detailed on the next page.

This revised schedule has a combined available weekly seat total of 187,536 for all carriers.

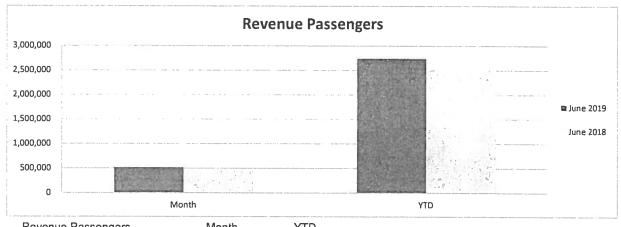

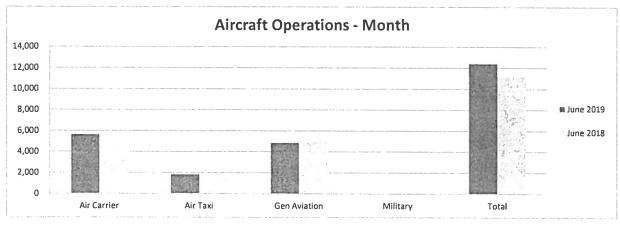
