APPROVAL OF TASK ORDER 2 REPLACEMENT PASSENGER TERMINAL PROJECT

Presented by Patrick Lammerding Deputy Executive Director, Planning and Development

<u>SUMMARY</u>

Staff seeks a recommendation from the Executive Committee ("Committee") to the Commission to approve a proposed Task Order 2, copy attached, in the amount of \$79,213,611 to fund the following items related to the construction of the Replacement Passenger Terminal ("RPT") Project.

Component Guaranteed Maximum Price ("CGMP") for two items:

- 1. CGMP 01: for the Terminal Building Mechanical, Electrical, and Special Systems ("MEP") in the amount of **\$3,829,573**;
- 2. CGMP 02 for Civil Site Work in the amount of **\$69,084,038 \$66,803,938**;

Authorization to utilize Owner Allowances:

- 3. Allowance for potential unforeseen environmental hazards or conditions incurred during the civil site work in the amount of **\$3,000,000**;
- 4. Allowance for compliance with new U.S. Department of Labor rules for the calculation of prevailing wages under Davis Bacon in the amount of **\$300,000**; and
- 5. Allowance for permit applications to the City of Burbank Building and Safety Department in the amount of **\$3,000,000**.

BACKGROUND

On December 19, 2022, the Commission awarded Holder, Pankow, TEC – A Joint Venture ("HPTJV") a design-build agreement for the RPT Project. HPTJV has begun design and preconstruction efforts and has reached several milestones, including the design concept selection by the Commission on April 17, 2023. As part of the preconstruction efforts, the design-build agreement provides for HPTJV's submission of CGMP proposals for incremental elements of the work. Submittal requirements and preparation guidelines for CGMP proposals are addressed in PR-04 of Exhibit H of the design-build agreement.

HPTJV solicited, per the FAA approved Procurement Plan, subcontractors for trade packages that make up CGMP 01 and 02.

CGMP 01 – Terminal MEP

The purpose of obtaining MEP services prior to design completion is to assist the design services to achieve the most cost-efficient, high-performance design. It also allows for full cost transparency for material costs, pre-negotiated labor rates for all union positions, integration of pre-fabrication for complex systems into the design, and flexibility to place long lead equipment orders. Additionally, the MEP firms will be on board to perform project start up scope activities associated with the temporary utility connections and on-site trailer connections. Services under this CGMP include:

- Six months of preconstruction and design assist services:
 - Value Engineering, Constructability Reviews, shop drawing submission, and Options Analysis
 - Competitively bid General Conditions and Fee %
 - Project Startup Scope Allowances for MEP subcontractors Temporary Utility connections, On-Site Trailer Connections, Purchase Orders for Long Lead Equipment

The total price for CGMP - 01 is \$3,829,573 which is \$1,622,213 under budget.

CGMP - 02 - Civil Site Work

This CGMP is for the procurement of the following trade packages:

- 1. Earthwork / Site Enablement:
 - Site demolition of the project site
 - Mass grading of the project site
 - Deep utility installation for storm & sanitary sewer piping and structures
 - Furnishing and installation of site retaining wall along east boundary of the project site
 - Site logistics installation, including access road, crane road, parking, and laydown areas for construction use
 - Erosion control and maintenance of the project site
- 2. Shoring Systems:
 - Turnkey below grade shoring systems as required to support construction of below-grade level of the Parking Garage
- 3. Temporary Fencing:
 - All temporary fencing as required to support phased turnover of the project site to the HPTJV project team, and as necessary to support future construction activities.
- 4. Temporary Power:
 - Furnishing and installation of a turnkey design-build temporary power solution for the project site, inclusive of power duct banks from Tulare Avenue to the site,

a temporary power yard, and all duct banks to provide temporary power access across the site

The total price for this CGMP - 02 proposal is \$69,084,038 **\$66,803,938** and is \$5,479,814 **\$4,542,240** under budget.

Allowance for unknown and potentially hazardous environmental conditions:

 The RPT is being constructed on the Adjacent Property, which is a portion of the former Lockheed Plant B-6 Site and is a known environmental Superfund site. Although Lockheed undertook remediation of the site and obtained a "Finding of No Further Action" from the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board, there are potential risks for encountering unknown hazards or environmental conditions. Staff seeks an allowance of \$3,000,000 to address such a circumstance if it arises.

Allowance for compliance with Davis Bacon rule change:

• Effective October 23, 2023, new U.S. Department of Labor rules applicable to the calculation of prevailing wages (ref.:88 FR 57526) apply. Staff seeks an allowance of \$300,000 to address the potential cost impact associated with these new rules.

Allowance for permit fees, City of Burbank, Building and Safety Department:

 Per PR-01.B.2.b.2 of Exhibit H of the design-build agreement, HPTJV is responsible for procuring permits for construction packages. Within the Design to Budget, under Owner Allowance, \$7,141,160 is allocated for the cost of permits and utility connection fees. HPTJV seeks an initial amount of \$3,000,000 for such fees to procure all applicable permits and will reconcile the final fee costs in future pay applications. A schedule of anticipated submission dates to the City is attached.

FUNDING

The adopted FY 2023-2024 budget includes appropriations in the amount of \$123,483,956 for the RPT Project early works and pre-construction packages. These costs are programmed to be initially funded through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law grants and commercial paper program pending issuance of the construction financing scheduled for the late spring of 2024.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Committee recommend to the Commission that it approve proposed Task Order No. 2 in the amount \$79,213,611 \$76,933,511 and authorize the Executive Director to execute same.

Removal of Potential Hazards or Unknown Environmental Conditions

• The Adjacent Property is located on a portion of the former Lockheed Plant B-6 Site. Davis Bacon – Implementation of Rule Change for Prevailing Wage Calculations

• This contingency is requested to account for cost impacts associated with the recent U.S. Department of Labor rule changes associated with the calculation of prevailing wages (88 FR 57526) which are effective from October 23, 2023. Staff requests **\$300,000** contingency be authorized to cover potential additional cost to comply with these rule changes.

Permit Fees

- As part of the preconstruction efforts, the project team has begun submitting plans for review and permitting to the City of Burbank Building and Safety Department. In accordance with PR-01.B.2.b.2 of the design-build agreement, HPTJV is responsible for procuring permits for construction packages submitted to the City.
- Within the current RPT budget under Owner Allowances, \$7,141,160 is allocated for permitting and utility connection fees. Staff is requesting \$3,000,000 be authorized out of the \$7,141,160 allowance for the initial permit fees.
- HPTJV will use these funds to procure the applicable permits and reconcile differences with the final permit fee costs in future pay applications.



Site Plan





Project Goals

- Comply with the City of Burbank Art in Public Places Program
- Alignment with progressive design-build project delivery
- Commission an impactful and unique landmark for the enjoyment and appreciation of airport patrons
- Selection of site and materials suitable for long-term display within airport operations
- Showcase the talents of regional artists

Artwork Proposal Selection Process

- Convene Art Advisory Panel
- Develop artwork opportunities and RFP with input from HPTJV
- Solicit input from Art Advisory Panel and HPTJV for Artist Candidates
- 16 Artist Candidates were identified for the exterior opportunity and 15 for the interior opportunity
- Artist Candidates submittals were evaluated by the Art Advisory Panel using selection criteria
- Top ranking Finalists received the RFP (5 per opportunity)
- SFG hosted a pre-submittal briefing with BGPAA and HPTJV for Candidates
- Finalists participated in a mid-point review with SFG to ensure a complete submittal
- Finalist submitted proposals on schedule
- Proposals were reviewed by BGPAA and HPTJV for comment
- Candidates interviewed with the Art Advisory Panel with the opportunity to present additional visual material
- Comments from the BGPAA and HPTJV were shared with the Art Advisory Panel
- Proposals were ranked by the Art Advisory Panel using the selection criteria stated in the RFP

Artwork Proposal Scoring Criteria

Artistic Merit: Maximum Score 30%. How the artwork provides an impactful, creative, and unique landmark through the manipulation of elements such as rhythm, harmony, balance, contrast, movement, proportion, and variety.

Appropriateness: Maximum Score 30%. Contextual alignment with the Project's vision for the site, curatorial approach, and suitability for long-term display for the enjoyment and appreciation of airport patrons, the general public, and the adjacent communities of Burbank, Glendale, and Pasadena.

Work Plan & Technical Approach: Maximum Score 30%. How thoroughly the work plan demonstrates an in-depth and thoughtful understanding of how the key milestones will be met, delivered on time, and will be structurally sound, and in accordance with all regulatory requirements that allow the airport to operate in a safe, secure and efficient manner.

Budget: Maximum Score 10%. Feasibility, to cover the technical needs and creative vision of the artwork, without compromising a quality outcome.

Gisela Colón

Gisela Colón was raised in San Juan, Puerto Rico, and has lived and worked in Los Angeles, for the past three decades. Her personal experiences of growing up in Puerto Rico, inspired by a scientist father and artist mother, and a live long interest in astronomy, manifest both physically and metaphorically into large scale sculptures that radiate cosmic energy, beauty and light, and consider the vastness of the universe.

As a Latinx artist she intends to realize iconic site-specific sculptures to uplift diverse audiences, while opening up space for other women and under represented people to dream of possibilities.

Colón has exhibited internationally throughout the United States, Europe, Egypt, the Middle East, and Latin America. Her work is included in the collections of the Los Angeles County Museum of Art; El Museo Del Barrio, New York, and the Perez Art Museum Miami.







Cliff Garten

Cliff Garten works out of his studio based in Venice, CA.

Trained as an artist as well as a landscape architect, he connects people to places and infrastructure through sculptural material, social history and ecology. He uses sculpture to define our interaction and movement by creating energy between things, generating interest in public activity, reframing our private lives and creating a sense of place within public and private realms.

Garten is an internationally recognized sculptor, recipient of two Individual Artist Fellowships from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Bush Foundation Fellowship for Individual Artists and Leadership Fellowship and the Jerome Foundation Traveling Artist Grant. His sculptures have consistently been named best in the nation by The Americans for the Arts and cited for design excellence by the American Society of Landscape Architects.







Phillip K. Smith III

Phillip K. Smith III was raised in the Coachella Valley and has worked out of his Palm Desert studio for the past two decades.

Smith creates light-based work that draws upon ideas of space, form, color, light, shadow, environment, and change. The artworks are intensely physical and highly mediative, affecting perception and encouraging viewers to connect more directly to the beauty of their environment.

Smith has exhibited internationally throughout the United States, and Europe. He is known for creating large scaled temporary artworks at the Coachella and Desert X. His permanent public artworks are sited in Los Angeles, San Francisco, Kansas City, Nashville, Oklahoma City and beyond; and the artist was recently commissioned to create permanent, light-based works for the cities of West Hollywood and Bellevue, WA.






Rob Ley, founder of Rob Ley studio, is an artist who has been based in Los Angeles for the past two decades.




FreelandBuck
